

Northwest Lutherans Convene in Salem

Central Church Host to 200 at Annual Meeting

Business sessions will be featured today in the annual West Coast District convention of Lutheran Free Churches, underway at Salem's Central Lutheran Church.

Some 150 pastors and lay delegates from 30 churches of Oregon and Washington are here for the meeting, which stressed devotional periods Friday. Attendance is to reach 200 by Sunday.

Following a fellowship banquet this evening, Dr. T. O. Burntvedt, Minneapolis, Minn., president of the church, will speak on stewardship.

Sunday Pastor Lester A. Dahlen, Seattle, district president, will speak on the Central Lutheran broadcast at 8:30 a.m. on KOCO; church worship service; Pastor Christian G. Olson, Seattle, in the afternoon, and Pastor Bernhard Brethme, Shelton, Wash., in the evening. All are public services.

Pastors will remain here for a retreat Monday, to discuss problems and trends of church work. Dr. Burntvedt will report on his attendance at last summer's world conference of Lutherans in Hannover, Germany.

Board Planning New Church In East Salem

EAST SALEM—An organization to lay the groundwork for building a new Christian Church in the Svegle area was formed at a meeting of representatives of the three Christian churches in Salem.

Paul Holloway of First Christian Church was chosen as chairman of the group and K. S. Thurston of the Court Street Church will be secretary-treasurer.

Other members of the committee include Eugene Crall and Roy Conder of First, A. A. Friesen and J. P. Hurd of Court Street, and Fred Robertson and the Rev. John Myers of Liberty.

The Rev. Leonard Camp was chosen to serve temporarily as minister on a part-time basis. Residing in Turner, he already has begun visitation work. It is hoped to start services about mid-March.

Legislation Gets Action By Presbytery

The Presbytery of Willamette agreed Wednesday to support the state legislative civil liberties bill and the bill which would place pari-mutuel betting revenues into the general fund, but opposes the removal of television and radio liquor advertisement regulations.

These resolutions were adopted at the religious group's meeting in Mill City. The Presbytery includes some 30 churches.

Of the gambling revenue-general fund proposal the group said "This will end the false identification of the welfare of fair and character-building agencies with the perpetuation of gambling of horses and dogs."

"We deplore," the Presbytery resolution said, "the action of the Liquor Control Board in removing all time limitation on liquor advertising... we urge... a bill... prohibiting any radio or TV program advertising liquor during day and early evening hours, at least until 8 p.m."

In another action the meeting commended Sen. Douglas Yeater of Marion County for introducing a proposal to abolish capital punishment. It directed a study of the problem by churches.
