

Hialeah Slates \$100,000 Event

'Admiral', Spartan Valor Co-Favorites

MIAMI, Fla. (AP) — Nine finely trained thoroughbreds were named Friday for the 16th running of the \$100,000 added Widener Handicap at Hialeah Park Saturday.

Crafty Admiral, victor in the \$50,000 McLennan, and Spartan Valor, the defending champion, were rated co-favorites for this mile and a quarter test.

Nominated to race with Crafty Admiral and Spartan Valor were Alerted, Battlefield, Oil Capitol, How, Happy Go Lucky, Admiral Frisks and Golden Tread.

If all nine start, the race will gross \$131,400 and the winner will get \$94,200.

Crafty Admiral won the \$50,000 McLennan and the Royal Palm, both run on wet tracks, and the forecast for a possible shower or two Saturday morning increased his chances. A fast track would be to the advantage of the Admiral's chief rivals, Spartan Valor and George D. Widener's Battlefield.

Brosch Leads Mexican Meet

MEXICO CITY (AP) — Al Brosch, who often starts fast but sometimes slows down in the stretch, Friday continued his hot opening day pace and forged into the lead in the ninth Mexican Open Golf Tournament.

The 41-year-old Garden City, N. Y. professional, who Thursday was tied with John Palmer of Charlotte, N. C., for first, shot a five-under-par 67 to lead the field of about 162 contestants with a 26-hole total of 131.

Palmer shot a 70 and slid into a three-way tie for second.

Araujo Closer To Title Shot

NEW YORK (AP) — Sharp-shooting George Araujo, 22-year-old Providence, R. I., prospect, inched closer to a title shot with light-weight champion Jimmy Carter Friday night by winning a split decision over Paddy (The Billy-goat) de Marco in a 10-rounder at Madison Square Garden.

Araujo weighed 133 1/2, De Marco 135.

MOSCOW, Idaho (AP) — The University of Washington swimming team, defending champion of the Northern Division, won its 32nd straight dual meet victory over Idaho Friday, 50-50.

The Huskies racked up firsts in eight of the ten events. They were disqualified for jumping the gun in the 400-yard relay and Idaho won by default.

Bob Hamblin, former Salem High School was first in the 200-yard backstroke event for the Huskies in a time of 2:25.3. Hamblin also was a member of the Washington 300-yard medley relay team that won in that event.

Decorated, Chanlea Top Favorites ... ABC Kegling Classic Starts Action Today

ARCADIA, Calif. (AP) — Bright skies, a fast track and an excellent field of 11 3-year-olds are in prospect for the 16th running of the \$100,000 Santa Anita Derby Saturday.

There were no surprises when the entry box closed for the mile and one-eighth romp.

The one-two favorites in pre-race calculations are two Kentucky-bred youngsters, Decorated, racing for automobile dealer, Andy Crevolin of nearby Alhambra, and Chanlea, wearing the colors of the famed Calumet Farm in the Blue Grass state.

Named with them were Alfred G. Vanderbilt's Social Outcast, the Springhill stable's De Anza, Mrs. Gordon Bulwer's Corroborant, Rocking M ranch's Merryman, Rex C. Ellsworth's Boo Who, M & S stable's Black Rascal, Louis B. Mayer's Swell, Allison and Prestidge's Invigorator and Clement L. Hirsch's Rock Circle.

The weatherman forecast clear skies and 60 to 65 more than are expected to gather in Santa Anita's spacious confines.

The purse will have a gross value of \$131,600 and the net money to the winner will be \$84,500 if all 11 go to the post, as expected.

Awaiting the derby call are some of the nation's most famous jockeys. Eddie Arcaro goes on Chanlea, Johnny Longden on Decorated, Eric Guerin on Social Outcast, Willie Shoemaker on Invigorator and Jack Westrop on Black Rascal.

Baseball Wins In Court Test

CINCINNATI (AP) — Baseball survived another assault on its player reserve clause Saturday.

The U. S. Court of Appeals, sixth circuit, ruled that baseball is a sport and not a business. Therefore, it said, there is no violation of anti-trust laws.

Losers in the test case are Jack Corbett, former owner of the El Paso, Tex., club in the Texas-Arizona League, and Walter J. Kowalski, a player in the Brooklyn chain of clubs.

Talbert Reaches Pro Net Semis

NEW YORK (AP) — Billy Talbert of New York, seeded No. 2, swept into the semi-final round of the National Indoor Tennis Championships by subduing Eugene Garrett, former UCLA ace, at the Seventh Regiment Armory Friday night, 6-2, 6-1, 6-4.

Talbert's next opponent will be the winner of the tilt Saturday between Denmark's Kurt Nielsen and Noel Brown of Santa Monica, Calif.

Grant Golden of Wilmette, Ill., seeded fourth, joined Talbert in the round of four by expelling Lorne Main, Canada's second-ranking player, 6-4, 6-3, 6-4.
