Strawberry Carryover Not Major Problem, Growers Told

SILVERTON — While 6 per cent more strawberries are in cold storage now than a year ago at this time, the carryover shouldn't be much of a problem to the strawberry growers this year, Henry Ensey, manager of the Oregon City plant of the J. M. Smucker Co., told some 100 berry growers which met Wednesday at the Knights of Pythias Hall.

Demand has been very good since the first of the year, Ensey continued, adding that with the acreage up only 500 acres in the entire United States the year ahead would indicate a good one for the berryman.

When looking at a long range program for strawberries, Ensey said that in the future emphasis should be put on greater production per acre and not expansion acre-wise. He urged, too, a definite program to make the consumer quality conscious.

California Gains
Statistically speaking, Ensey pointed out that in 1941, California produced 8 per cent and Oregon 10 per cent of the strawberries grown in the United States, while in 1952, California produced 24 per cent and Oregon 13 per cent. Blackberries, too, give promise of a good crop, both in yield and

Airman Hero Welcomed to Toppenish

TOPPENISH, Wash. — A modest, young airman who saved 27 lives in the recent English flood disaster returned home to his hero's welcome Wednesday—and protested that he was "just one of 150 men in a good Air Force outfit" deserving medals.

Airman Second Class Reis L. Leming, 22, was escorted here in a motorcade from Yakima, where he was greeted at the airport by several hundred persons including the mayor of Toppenish and other city dignitaries.

His arrival home was the occasion for the biggest celebration since last year's annual July 4 Pow Wow.

Susan Leming, the 15-year-old sister of the youth who is to receive the George Medal from Queen Elizabeth II of England, was the first to greet the hero when his plane landed at Yakima.

She and his fiancée, Mary Ann Ramsey, rode with him in an open car during parades at Yakima and here.

Miss Ramsey was in New York to meet Leming when he returned from England, where he is stationed. They plan to be married in England in June.

Leming will spend a 30-day leave in Toppenish before returning to England to receive the highest award given a foreigner in peace time. His fiancée will resume her senior studies at Whitman College.

Engine Crosses Burned-Out Bridge

KLAMATH FALLS — Railroadmen told Wednesday how they rode a locomotive across unsupported rails over a gully between here and Bly.

Four train crew members said they saw, too late to stop, that a fire had destroyed a 17-foot-long trestle over a 10-foot-deep gully. The 165-ton diesel Southern Pacific locomotive rolled safely across, though.

The following cars were not so fortunate. The first car went into the gully, and pulled three more cars with it. The accident happened late Monday east of Sprague River.

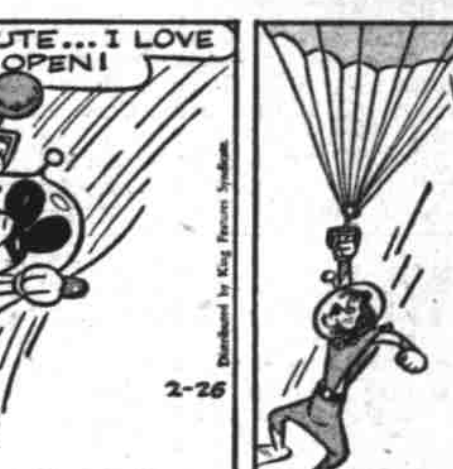
