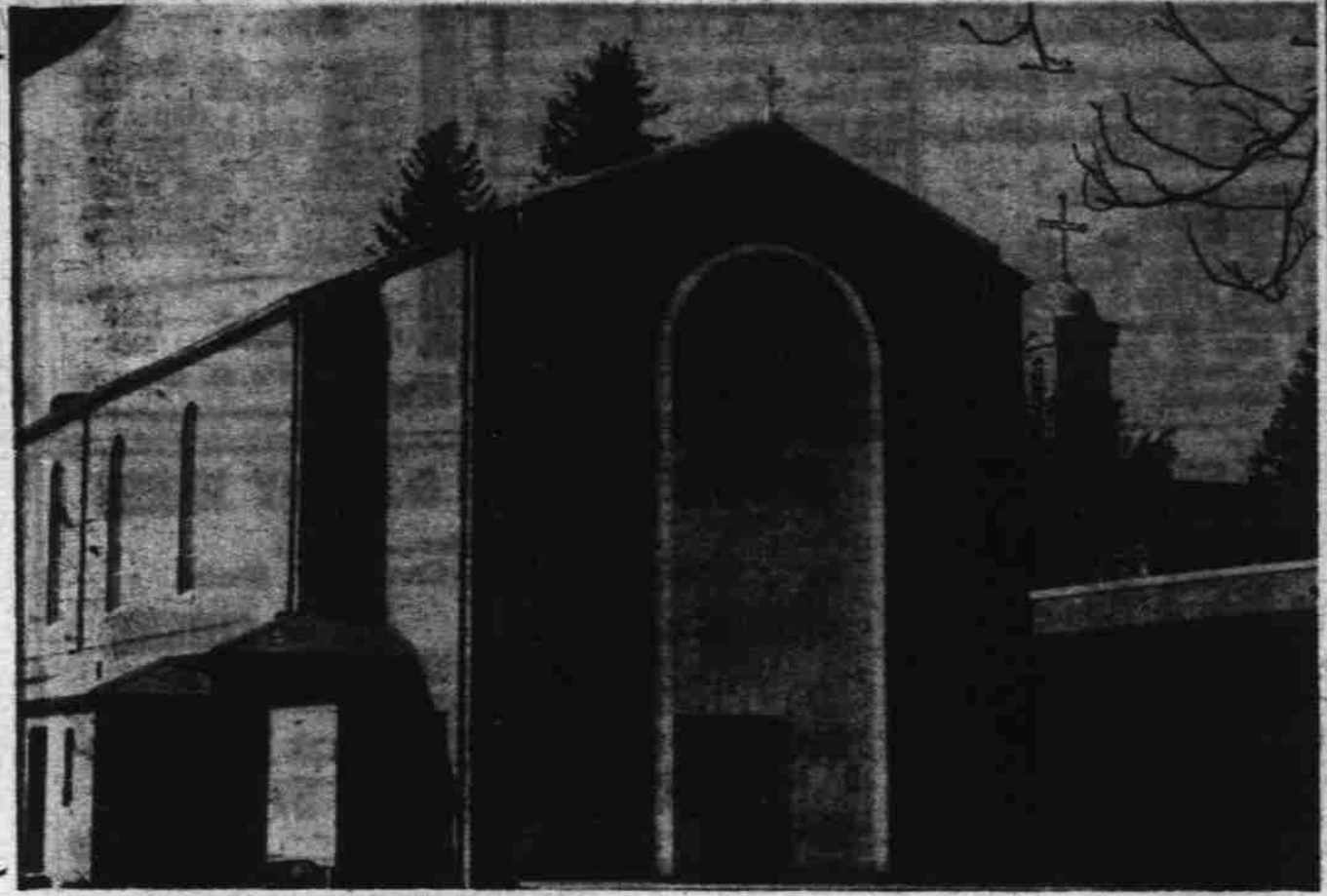


# St. Joseph's Parish to Dedicate New Church Today

## Archbishop to Bless Building at Special Service

Parishioners of St. Joseph's Catholic Church in Salem will join in dedicating their new church at 10 a.m. today, as the start of worship services in the \$400,000 structure.

Blessing of the cornerstones and building, an outside ceremony, is to begin the services, conducted by the Most Rev. Edward D. Howard, archbishop of Portland. He also will lead the solemn pontifical mass, assisted by several other priests of the Salem area.

Erection of the concrete, brick-veneered structure at Winter and Cheneketa Streets began a year ago this month. It is just east of the frame church which has served the parish since 1889. It will be razed to make way for a new rectory.

Following the rites at the church will be a 1 p.m. luncheon at the Marion Hotel for the clergy and a number of guests including state and city officials.
