

Man Killed as Truck Dumps

BAKER (AP) — A county road mechanic was crushed to death Tuesday in an unusual accident that occurred while he was painting a dump truck.

He was Robert F. Hottel, 60, a long-time employee of the road department.

Coroner Thad Beatty said Hottel was underneath the truck. Somehow he tripped the dump mechanism, and a part of the truck fell on him. His widow and several children survive.

Queen Adds Title to Duke

LONDON (AP) — Queen Elizabeth II Tuesday appointed her husband, the Duke of Edinburgh, to be Grand Master and First Knight, Grand Cross, of the Order of the British Empire.

The duke succeeds the queen's grandmother, the late Queen Mary, as Grand Master of the order, which was established in 1917. The reigning queen herself is head of the order.

College Grads Swell Ranks Of Foresters

Future of Oregon's forests appears secure if book learning and higher education can make it so, according to Don Maus, Salem state forestry official.

The Oregon State Board of Forestry claimed to be one of the largest employers of Oregon State College forestry graduates with a total of 50 who had earned their forestry degrees at the Corvallis institution.

Many of the foresters began their careers as common laborers in logging camps and fire patrol associations and at least ten ended up with masters' degrees from Oregon State College.

In addition to the OSC graduates, the forestry department roster includes graduates from other well-known forestry schools as Yale, Duke, Syracuse, Iowa State, Michigan State, California, Idaho, Washington, Washington State, Harvard, Penn State, North Carolina State, and Utah.

Every phase of forestry is represented, with specialists in forest protection, research, silviculture, entomology, dendrology, timber sales, personnel and administration. Eighty-one professional foresters appear on the personnel rolls of the state forestry department.

Commentator Quits Job With 'Voice' Radio

NEW YORK (AP) — Radio Commentator Raymond Swing resigned his job as political analyst for the Voice of America Tuesday, saying the agency is "crippled x x by slanderous attacks on its integrity."

Swing said the state department is guilty of "spineless failure x x x to stand by its own staff."

For many years one of commercial radio's highest paid commentators, Swing left the Liberty Network in May, 1951, to join the Voice at \$10,800 a year.

He called this a "considerable financial sacrifice" and said he was undertaking the job as a public service.

In his letter of resignation, Swing wrote that budget cuts for the Voice "have reduced it to relative impotence."

Reedsport Firm Wins Forest Job

Brooks Logging Co., Reedsport, was awarded a contract by the State Forestry Department to remove blow down hemlock and cedar in the Loon Lake area of Elliott State Forest in Douglas County.

The purpose of removing such timber is to get it out before the bark beetle gets into it. About eight million board feet of timber are involved.

The company's bid was \$1.50 a thousand for removing hemlock and cedar, and \$7.50 a thousand for taking out a small amount of fir.

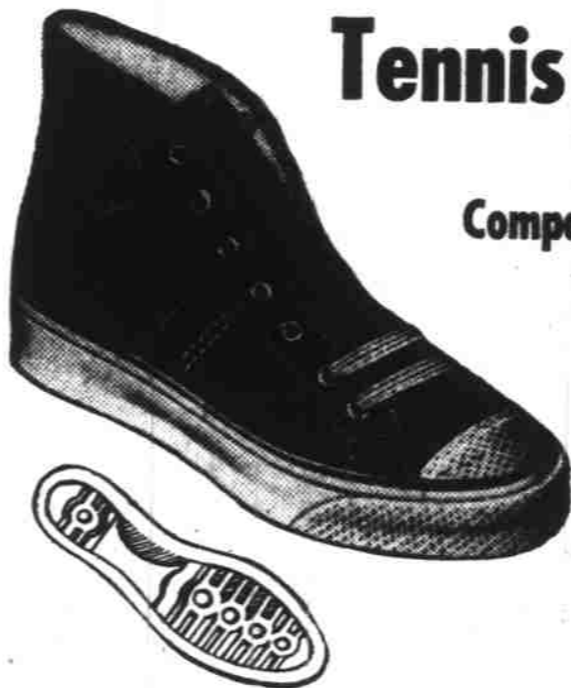

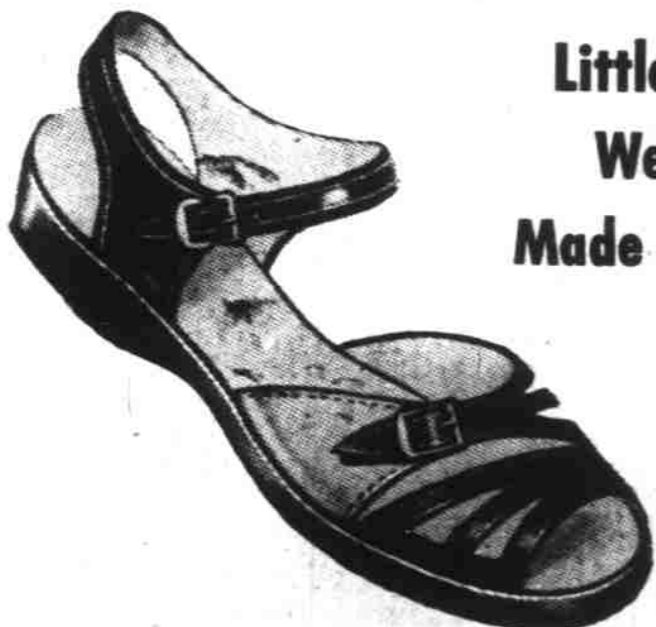

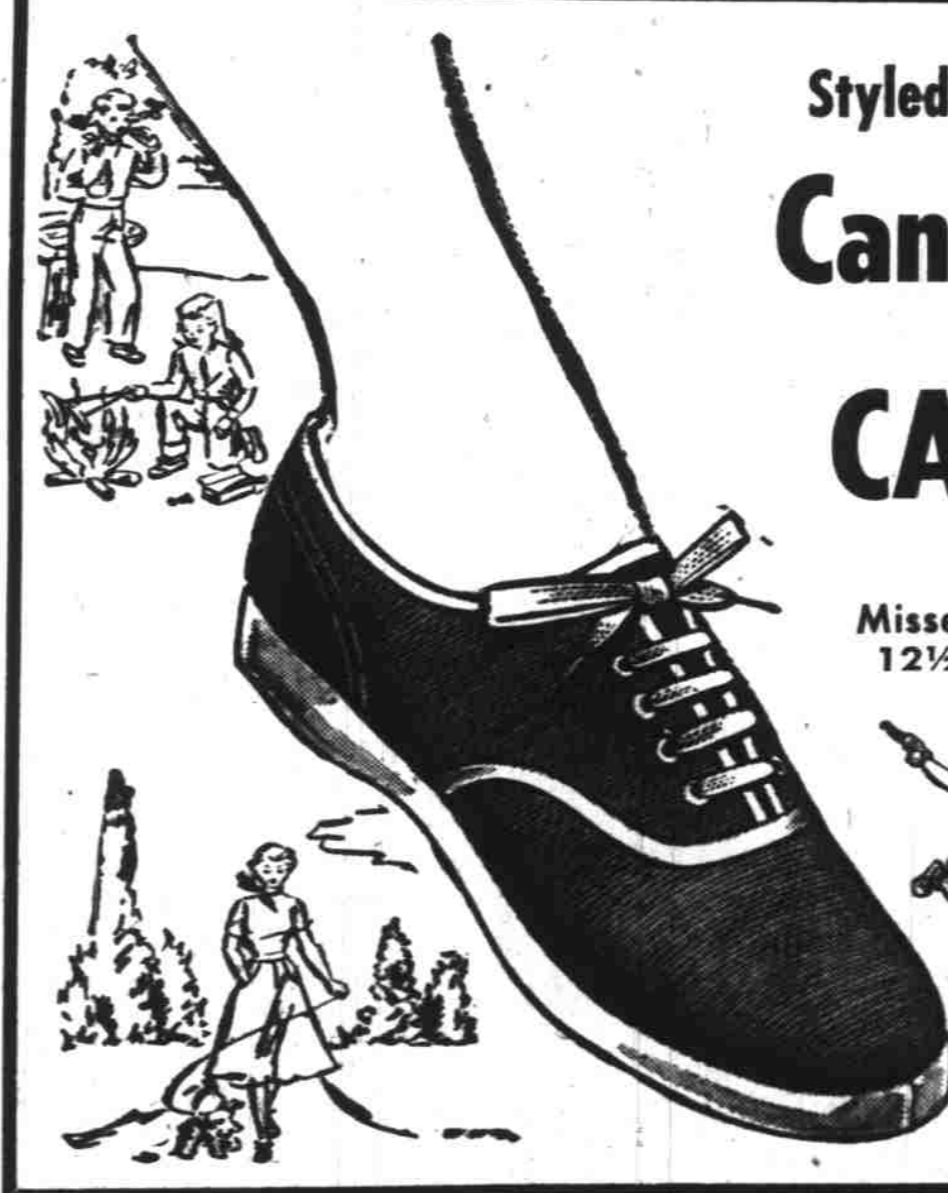
