CHICAGO (AP)—Liquidation sent May deliveries lower on the board of trade Wednesday in the last trading session for those contracts. May wheat dipped 3 cents a bushel, and all wheat contracts sank to new seasonal lows. Wheat closed 1/2 to 3 cents lower, corn 1/2 to 1 1/2 cents lower, oats 3/4 to 1 1/2 cents lower, rye down 3/4 to 1 1/2, soybeans 1/4 to 2 cents lower, and lard 5 to 15 cents a hundred pounds lower.
