## Confirmations | Pentecost - - A Birthday'

The "birthday of the church" will be observed Sunday by Christians, who call the day Pentecost or Whitsunday. It is the anniversary of the descent of the Holy Spirit on-to the 120 Christians assembled at Jerusalem 50 days after

Christ's resurrection. They were given a baptism of fire and the power of the Holy Spirit for the church as an organization.

The group had gathered in observation of the Jewish festival of thanksgiving known as Pentecost or Shabuoth. They had been directed to wait for this visitation of power before beginning their ministries.

The day became known as Whitsunday after the English and other North Europeans called it White Sunday from the white garments worn by newly baptized persons. For that area, the climate was much better for outdoor baptism at Pentecost than at Easter.

Because of its origin, the day is favorite among churches for baptism, confirmation and reception of members.
