

Chrysler, CIO Negotiations In Deadlock

DETROIT (AP)—Chrysler Corp. and the CIO United Auto Workers gave up their efforts to agree on changes in their five-year contract early Wednesday.

Their negotiations, which ran for nine hours, were recessed just 24 hours after Ford and the UAW came to terms on new and improved wage and pension clauses in their pact.

Another session with Chrysler was set for 3 p. m. Wednesday. The only comment from Chrysler and UAW representatives was that their talks were "progressing satisfactorily."

Chrysler President L. L. (Tex) Colbert personally took charge of the company's bargaining team. UAW and CIO President Walter R. Reuther, who was in on the Ford settlement, also led the union's new bargaining talks.

Ford gave its 135,000 production workers the pledge of \$137.50 a month maximum pensions, including social security. Previously it was \$125.

The company, as did General Motors last week, adjusted chief elements of its five-year cost-of-living contract with the CIO United Auto Workers.

It was felt inevitable that all contracts in the industry would be revamped as a result.

This would mean that the nation's total of 1,000,000 or more auto plant employees would be affected.
