

DETROIT on - Chrysler Corp. and the CIO United Auto-Workers gave up their efforts to agree on changes in their five-year contract early Wednesday.

Their negotiations, which ran for nine hours, were recessed just 24 hours after Ford and the UAW came to terms on new and improved wage and pension clauses in their pact. Another session with Chrysler

was set for 3 p. m. Wednesday. The only comment from Chrysler and UAW representatives was




