


Salem, Hermiston Notch Wins in Legion Journey

Seattle Again Defeats Portland Beavers, 2-1

The Seattle Rainiers' Steve Nagy, in constant trouble, proved to be too crazy for the Portland Beavers last night as the Rainiers won their third straight Coast League victory over the Beavs, 2-1. Nagy allowed nine hits, one more than losing Pitcher Fred Sanford gave up.

The Seattle win boosted the club to within 3 1/2 games of the league leading Hollywood Stars, who dropped a close 5-4 decision to the Los Angeles Angels before 13,153 fans at Hollywood, largest crowd in the history of Gilmore Field. LA won with a three-run rally in the ninth.

At Oakland Southpaw McCall hit a two-run homer and pitched seven-hit ball to beat the Oaks for San Francisco, 8-2. Loser was Al Gettel, who was trying for his 21st victory for the Oaks. He was biffed for 12 hits.

The San Diego Padres' Bob Kerrigan beat Sacramento 7-1, aided by a six-run fourth inning in which the Padres knocked Lefty Chet Johnson from the box.

Nagy himself doubled in the fifth inning and scored on Jack Tobin's single. George Schmees homered for Seattle in the sixth, which was to be the winning run.

Don Eggert's double and Don Kolloway's single scored Portland's only run in the eighth. Three Seattle double plays helped Nagy out potential runs against Seattle.

Caps Finally Beat Spokane

The Vancouver Caps finally dumped the Spokane Indians last night in WI League play, beating them for the first time in five tries, 7-5, at Spokane. The loss cost the Tribe a full game in its efforts to overtake league-leading Yakima and Vancouver in the sizzling hot second half pennant race.

Bob Roberts hurled the Caps victory, fanning 11. Harvey Storey homered for Vancouver and both Will Hafez and Jim Command had circuit wallops for Spokane. Hafez's was his 16th.

At Tri-City Jack Warren homered off Bill Brenner, but the Lewiston manager survived all storms and won his 16th victory, 8-7. He also got three hits.

The home run "farce" continued at Calgary where Edmonton again beat the Stampede 17 to 15. Nine "home runs" flew out of the tiny Calgary park, six by Stampede players. Ken Whitehead had two, Don Bricker, Ed Kapp, Rocky Tedesco and Charley Mead one each. Sam Kanelos, Clint Weaver and Dan Prentice made the circuit for the Eskies, who had 20 hits all told. Calgary made eight errors, four of 'em by Shortstop Whitehead.

An antelope hunt for 400 fortunate permit holders will be held from August 22 to August 27, inclusive, in two areas in south-eastern Oregon. License agents throughout the state have been provided with applications for antelope permits. Applications for permits must be in the Portland office of the game commission by 10 a.m. August 13. Drawings will be held August 13 and tags will be mailed on the following day.
