## Wheat Drops Behind; Rest Of Market Up

**CHICAGO (AP)**—Wheat ended a little lower, but all other cereals posted gains after a session of limited declines and rallies on the board of trade Thursday.

Wheat started out very strong, opening on gains extending to more than a cent. Buying stemmed from news the Agriculture Department had relaxed its requirements for government loans on rust-damaged wheat in the Northwest.

Within a few minutes, however, all the strength faded. Light hedging pressure kept the bread cereal under restraint the rest of the day.

At the close oats, and to a lesser extent soybeans, were showing the strength.

Wheat closed 1/4 cent lower, corn 1/2 cent higher, oats 1/4 cent higher, soybeans 1/2 cent higher and soybean meal 2 1/2 cents higher, all 22 to 42 cents a hundred pounds higher.
