

# Here's How Weekend Angling Picture Shapes Up

PORTLAND, Aug. 20 (AP)—The State Game Commission reported these Oregon fishing conditions Thursday:

Northwest — Sandy River is poor. Stream is roily from glacial silt. Other streams in the Mt. Hood area are clear but producing only fair fishing. A few steelhead and salmon are being taken at the mouth of the Sandy. Small lakes are producing fair catches. Fishing continues to be fair on the McKenzie and Willamette rivers and their tributaries. South Santiam is producing fair-sized catches of rainbow. The lakes in the McKenzie Pass area are fair. Clear Lake is still slow. Dorena Lake is slow although a few fair-sized rainbow are being caught. Fern Ridge and Cottage Grove

reservoirs and Triangle Lake are fair for spiny-ray fishing. Salmon fishing inside mouth of the Columbia is improving. Salmon fishing in Nehalem Bay is fair. Fishing for spiny-rays is fair. Sea-run cutthroat fishing is slow. Upstream trout angling is poor to fair. Angling in tidewater for sea-run cutthroat has been slow. A few jack salmon were taken in the Nestucca and a few salmon are in the bays.

Southwest — Salmon fishing has been good at Winchester Bay. Angling for spiny-ray and catfish has been good at Takkenitch and Siltcoos Lakes. Tammie Lake perch and catfish angling is good. Trout fishing is fair and improving. Bass fishing is very good at Loon Lake and trout

angling is fair. No good catches of sea-run cutthroat have been reported as yet from the bay. Salmon fishing in the lower Rogue is good and steelhead fishing has been fair offshore. Salmon fishing at Chetco Cove is good. Trout angling remains poor but slightly improved on the Rogue River — upper Rogue is best. Good catches are being made on dry flies in the Union Creek area and above. Some large trout are being taken in the Illinois River on lures. Catches of summer steelhead have been good on light-colored flies in the Steamboat area but slow on bait and wobblers at Winchester. Trout angling has improved between Cleveland Rapids and Winchester. Most of the

fish are caught on troll. Central-Blue Lake fly fishing has been excellent. Also good for trolling and still-fishing. Three Creeks Lake fishing is very good. Campground is completely open. East and Paulina Lakes are only fair. Wickiup Reservoir continues to be only fair. North and South Twin Lakes have been producing nice catches. Irish and Taylor Lakes are good. Todd Lake has been providing good catches of rainbow. Davis Lake has been good. Gold Lake continues to be good. Upper Deschutes River has been good and is expected to continue good. Sparks, Elk, and Big Lave Lakes are only fair. Waldo Lake is only fair. Crane Prairie Reservoir is starting to pick up. Ochocho Reservoir has been good.

# Softball Clubs Await Tourney

## State Meet to Open At Mill City Saturday

MILL CITY (Special)—Mill City, which got a lot of plaudits last year for its fine all-out job of hosting the State Softball Tournament, aims to be an equally fine host when the 1953 show unfolds at Allen Field Saturday.

First game of the five-day event finds the Salem Merchants and Tillamook meeting at 4:30 Saturday afternoon, following appropriate opening ceremonies. The tourney field will include eight teams, six of whom were definitely known as of Thursday night. In addition to the Salem and Tillamook entries, Bend, Hermiston, Corvallis and the host Mill City Kelly Lumbermen are sure of slots. The other two berths hinge on the outcome of playoffs between Eugene's Rubenstein's and North Bend and between Grants Pass and Lakeview.

Four games are set for Saturday's first round, two in the afternoon and two at night and four likewise will be played on Sunday in the double elimination meet.

The Sunday night program will be known as Shrine Night, with proceeds of the game going to the Shrine Children's Hospital in Portland. The Salem Shrine Club band and drill team will perform between games of the Sunday eve twinnish.

Officials are working for capacity crowds at every session. Allen Field seats around 1500.

YAKIMA, Wash. (AP)—Yakima, perennial Washington state winner, captured the Region 11 American Legion junior baseball championship Thursday with a 4-3 victory over Lewiston, Idaho, in their showdown game.

The Yakima club was scheduled to board a train Thursday night for Hastings, Neb., for the Section D Western playoffs.

A dropped fly ball in left field let in the tying and winning Yaki runs in the seventh inning to spoil a "clutch" four-hit, 18 strike-out effort by Lewiston's No. 2 hurler, Doug Randall.

Outfielder Irvin Moore said tearfully after the game that he caught Eddie Pleasant's skier in the web of his glove after Yakima loaded the bases, but the wobbling broke and the ball dropped to the ground. Singles by Len Davis and John Zaepfel and a hit batsman had jammed the sacks.

Lewiston got six hits off Yaki ace Tom Gibson, but three double plays got him out of hot water.

Randall and Gibson met earlier in the regional tourney, with Yakima winning 7-1. Gibson, a 6 foot 4, 200 pounder, is unbeaten in Legion play this season.

# Shrine Squads Finish Drills

## Wide Open Encounter Likely Saturday Eve

PORTLAND (AP)—State and City teams held their final intensive workouts Thursday for the 6th Oregon Shrine All Star football game at Multnomah Stadium Saturday night.

Those who have watched the squads continued to foresee the record for the annual contest. The highest scoring game to date was last year when State defeated City, 20-12.

Both 1953 teams have high touchdown potentials—good passers and receivers and backs with lots of speed in the open field.

In addition a 6-2-2-1 defense will be the first time since the game between the graduated high school stars was inaugurated. This should make concentrated goal line defenses harder. In past years the 6-2-2-1 setup has been compulsory only between the 10-yard line.

The City team worked out in the Stadium Thursday night to get used to the lights and the field. The Staters will do the same Friday night. No other drills are scheduled for Friday.

Pete Susick, Marshfield High, coach of the State squad, was non-committal about the possible outcome. He said only that his players "have been looking a lot better the past few days."

Harry Scarff, City coach, wouldn't predict the outcome but said he believed his squad "is one of the best balanced City teams I have ever seen." He added that it has good speed, adequate size and wonderful spirit.

# 24 Stock Cars to Roll In Saturday Meet Here

Twenty-four assorted Oldsmobiles, Dodges, Plymouths, Fords, Hudsons, etc., have been registered thus far for Saturday night's stock car racing program at Salem's Hollywood Bowl, Valley Sports officials announced Thursday. By the time the card takes off at 7:30 o'clock Saturday with the time trials, another three or four cars likely will be entered.

Barring crackerups or motor trouble during the trials and ensuing Trophy dash and heat races, all cars will start in the big 75-lap main event on the paved oval. It will be the second 75-lapper of the season here.

Leading Saturday night's driving pack are Herschel McGriff, winner of the recent 500-mile classic at Oakland, Cal., Don Dehaan, who along with McGriff won the 200-lap stock car meet at Portland Speedway recently; Bill Amick, who won the last 75-lapper here; Pat Diviny, second in that 75-lap romp, and Royce Hagerty, who placed third, but who won the first stock meet in Salem this season.

Competition for the No. 1 prize Saturday night is therefore expected to be keen.

McGriff will ride herd on a 1949 Oldsmobile '88.

Amick nosed out Diviny by a scant 100 yards in the last main event here, climaxing a thrill-packed race. Hagerty wasn't far behind. McGriff was in the California at the time and did not drive in the local test.
