

Weeks Asks End to Global Boondoggling

WASHINGTON (AP) — One Eisenhower Cabinet member has called for an end to "international handouts and global boondoggling," while another questioned the use of U.S. funds to build up "competitive enterprise" abroad.

Secretary of Commerce Weeks and Secretary of the Treasury Humphrey addressed a meeting of the Senate Banking Committee and a 100-man advisory group studying means of financing the expansion of world trade.

They indicated that bank loans and private investments more and more must replace U.S. grants in promoting trade and providing economic help to foreign countries.

Humphrey said that "the government must question both its right and its financial ability to continue to use taxpayers' money to finance investments abroad on a large scale in the development of competitive enterprise."

And he added that "more attention must be paid abroad to making investment attractive to foreign capitals."

Weeks said the 55-nation World Bank and the U.S. Export-Import Bank should be made more useful in strengthening the economies of friendly foreign nations.

That went to the core of the problem which the Senate committee is studying. The group was directed by Congress last June to study activities of the two banks "and their relationship to expansion of international trade."

Door-to-Door Tax Canvass Given Praise

PORTLAND (AP) — The door-to-door canvass of small businesses is bringing in more tax money for the federal government, Ralph Granquist, Oregon director for the Internal Revenue Bureau, said Tuesday.

He said nearly 12 per cent of the businesses were delinquent in tax paying.

The bureau is concentrating on small businesses in the canvass. Granquist said agents called on 2,399 of them last week and found 17 which had not filed returns, 251 which had not estimated income this year, 66 which had not withheld payroll taxes and 53 delinquent in reporting excise taxes.

He said 830 individuals also were visited. He said 5 had not filed returns and 69 others had not filed required estimates.

Czech Regime Mimics Russ

VIENNA, Austria (AP) — Communist Czechoslovakia's government has reorganized itself along the latest Soviet lines. Tightening of controls over the police and agriculture was among the effects of a wholesale shift of ministers.

The Prague Radio announced the shakeup, which was accompanied by a reorganization in the secretariat of the Czech Communist Party.

Western observers noted that changes closely followed pro-American riots that broke out in Pilsen, Prague and in Czech mine fields in June.

The situation in the mines is so critical that it was disclosed over the weekend soldiers are now working in them apparently because of miners' resistance.

Overseas Mail Rates to Rise

WASHINGTON (AP) — Postmaster General Summerfield announced here that he is raising the rates on foreign surface mail, except to Mexico and Canada, effective Nov. 1. Air Mail rates will remain unchanged.

The increases for surface mail are as follows:

Letters—from 5 cents for the first ounce and 3 cents for each additional ounce to 8 cents for the first ounce and 5 cents for each additional ounce.

Postcards—from 3 to 4 cents.

Samples, small packets and commercial papers—from 4 cents for the first two ounces and 2 cents for each additional two ounces to 3 cents for the first two ounces and 2 cents for each additional two ounces.

Gunman Fires, Victim Wet

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — Three boys approached the cashier's booth at an "el" station here Monday night.

One of the boys pulled out a pistol and ordered the cashier, Miss Helen Maloney, 36, to hand over her receipts. He reached in the cage and grabbed \$1.42 in change and, pointing the pistol at Miss Maloney, pulled the trigger. A stream of water struck the frightened cashier in the face.

The boys fled with the money.
