**Spray School Planned for Winter Period**

Preliminary plans for a ground and air spraying school this winter were made in Salem Thursday at a meeting of the state department of agriculture's advisory council under the 1953 herbicide law.

The group will confer with F. E. Price, dean of agriculture of the state college, to see if arrangements can be made to hold the school again this year on the college campus.

Jack Sather, Clatskanie, is chairman of the council and Frank McKennon, chief of the ODA, division of plant industry, is secretary.

The council set up a program committee for the school, with Erle Parker of Dayton representing the ground operators and Arlo Livingstone of Corvallis, the aerial sprayers. The meeting at Salem also set in motion plans for a new feature, an exhibit of equipment used in ground and air spraying operations.
