Heltzel Hears Springfield Power Dispute

Mountain States Power Company was attacked Thursday in a hearing before Charles H. Heltzel, public utilities commissioner, for lowering rates inside Springfield to compete with the city-owned Springfield Power Company.

An order issued by former public utilities commissioner George H. Flagg which permitted the Mountain States Company to reduce rates was said by William S. Fort, Springfield attorney, to be improperly issued. He represents four customers of the Mountain States Company.

His clients, he said, are suffering from discrimination because the company's customers inside Springfield get power 20 to 25 per cent cheaper than customers outside the city.

Francis Hill, attorney for the company, maintained that power companies have a right to reduce rates to meet competition in different localities. He argued that the Mountain States Company had to cut rates to remain in business in Springfield.

Fort asserted that the law forbids any power company from discriminating against its customers but Hill said the law did not mean that at all. Men who brought the action are G. W. Btqua, James S. Primrose, Frank Vanchura and Paul W. Campbell.

Woman Fails To Win Injur Suit After Fall

A Salem woman, who brought an injury claims suit against friends, in whose home she took a tumble, failed to collect damages in a Marion County Circuit Court trial Thursday.

Catherine MacDonald had filed the complaint against A. G. and Ruth L. McGuire, 1369 Center St., seeking \$9,944 damages. The plaintiff alleges she was a guest in the McGuire home on May 14, 1952, and had gone to get her wraps when she slipped on a small rug at the entrance to a bedroom.

The complaint alleged negligence on the part of the McGuires for having a slipping rug on a highly polished floor and for not warning the plaintiff about it.

After about one and one-half hours deliberation the jury returned a verdict in favor of the McGuires.

KSLM-TV Plan Aired by Hoss

Organizational planning and personnel screening already are underway for KSLM-TV in Salem, the Salem Lions Club was told Thursday.

Dave Hoss, KSLM manager, said there were too many unknown factors to make a definite prediction as to when the TV station would be on the air, but that work is well started toward obtaining an increase of power (6,000 to 100,000 watts) and a transmitter site deemed more advantageous than the Eola Hills tract listed in the original application.

Hoss reviewed the efforts of Glenn McCormick, president of KSLM, to obtain a TV channel for Salem, pointed out that KSLM's application was the first filed for this area and said that with the recent withdrawal of a competitive filing and the subsequent FCC channel grant, KSLM-TV (VHF Channel 3) will be on the air "as quickly as sound business and planning practices will allow."
