Toozes to Be Dinner Hosts

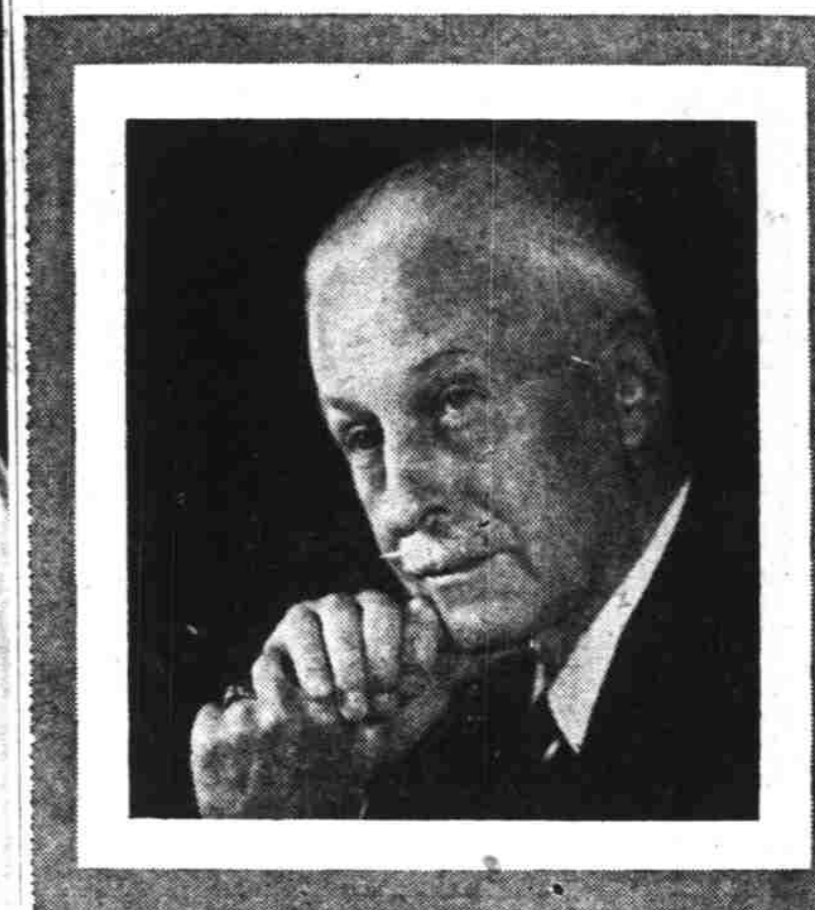

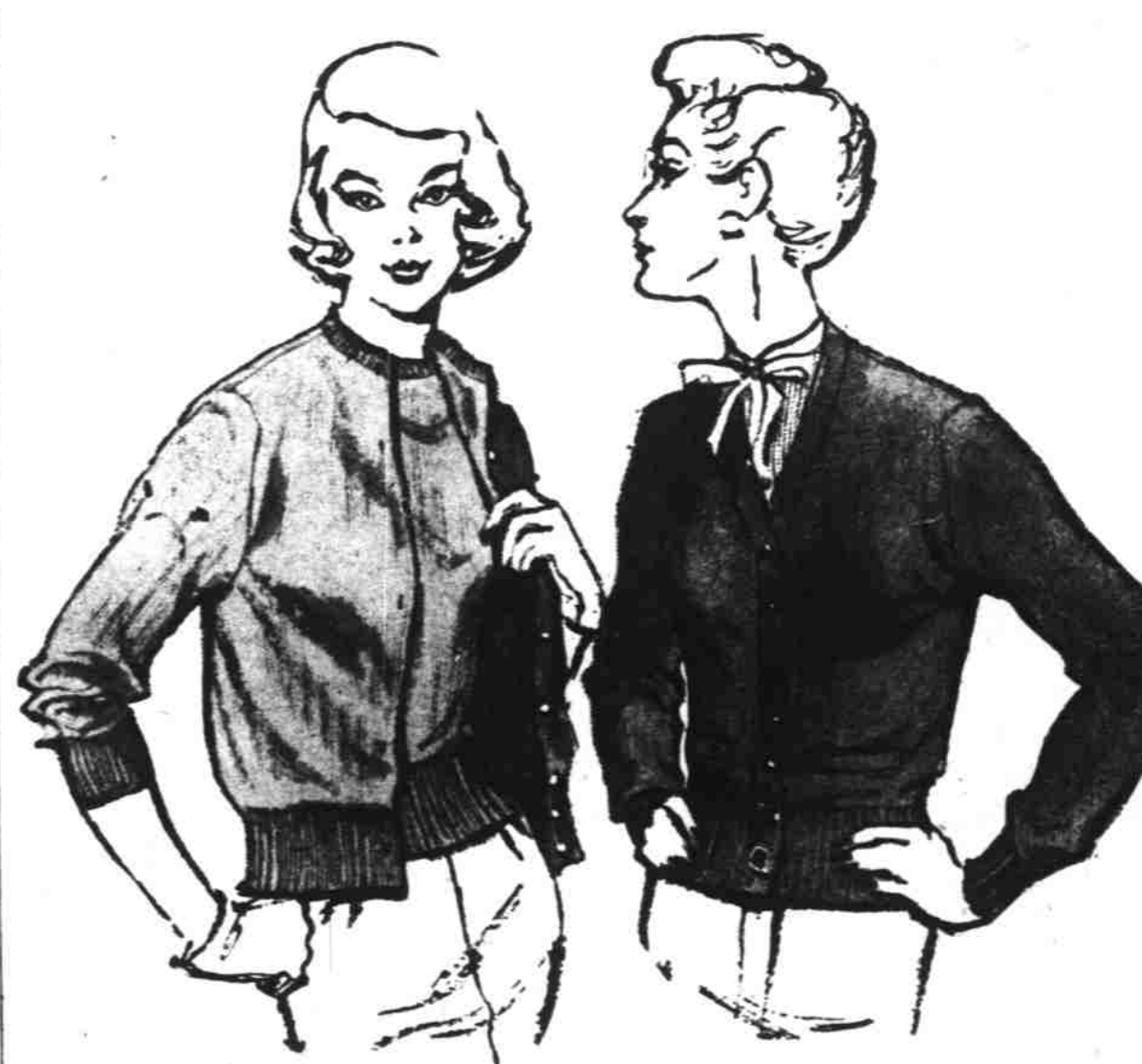
