432 Farm Units To Be Ready in Columbia Basin

WASHINGTON — Secretary of the Interior McKay announced Wednesday that 432 farm units consisting of 41,606 acres will be opened for homesteading and sale this year on five reclamation projects.

The scheduled land openings include: Two hundred fifty-four farms on the Columbia Basin Project in Washington, to be made available in January, February and March; And 85 farms in the North Side Pumping Division of the Minidoka Project in Idaho, to be opened in February.
