Bids Accepted On Six BLM Timber Tracts

More than 10 million board feet of timber on lands administered by the Bureau of Land Management were offered for bids Tuesday by the district forester in Salem. Total amount bid on the six tracts was \$230,292. The sale price exceeded the total appraised price by 52 per cent.

Purchaser of the largest tract, 5,399,000 board feet on La Dee Bench in Clackamas County, was Glen E. Clark of Estacada. The appraised price of \$13.60 per thousand board feet for the Douglas fir and \$8.15 per thousand board feet for the western hemlock, were raised to \$21.35 and \$22, respectively.

Lulay Brothers Lumber Company of West Scio was the high bidder for 3,067,000 board feet of timber located east of Scio in Linn County. The company bid \$88,370. A high bid of \$30.25 per thousand was received for the Douglas fir timber on this tract. Highest Price Offered

Another Linn County offering, comprised of 632,000 board feet of timber adjacent to the Quartzville Creek timber access road, went to W. S. Strubbar of Sweet Home. His sealed bid totaled \$17,665 and included a price of \$39. per thousand board feet for the Douglas fir. This was the highest price offered during the three-hour sale, according to the Salem district forester.

Marvin H. Light of Boring was the successful bidder for 380,000 board feet of fire-killed, second-growth Douglas fir near Brightwood in Clackamas County. He bid \$8 per thousand board feet for the timber.

Two tracts of salvage timber in Benton County, one of 300,000 board feet and one of 300,000 board feet, were purchased by Hendrix Shingle Company of Corvallis and Orville Hockema of Alsea. Respective total sale prices were \$6,600 and \$5,965.

Bidding Rapid

Rapid bidding characterized all the timber auctions, with from two to six bidders participating in each offering. Approximately 50 interested persons attended the sale.

The next regularly scheduled timber sale in the Salem Forest District will be on Tuesday, Feb. 9, 1954. Information concerning the timber to be offered for bids may be obtained from the district forester at 460 North High St., Salem.

Four Accused In Reuther Shooting Case

DETROIT (AP) — Prosecutors Wednesday accused four men of conspiracy and assault with intent to murder CIO president Walter P. Reuther five years ago, and withheld names of four other persons sought in what they called a "solution" to the attempted assassination.

Wayne County Prosecutor Gerald K. O'Brien disclosed names of three men in jail and a fourth still being sought, but withheld names of the other four and information on evidence he had before the pre-dawn announcement and arrests Wednesday.

O'Brien in saying "this is the solution," added, however: "There may be other involvements."

One of those arrested and the one sought figured prominently in hearings of the Kefauver Senate Crime Committee here in February, 1951. Both conceded they had made huge profits on scrap metal contracts with two companies, both often the scenes of violence in union attempts to organize them.

One is Carl Renda, 35, arrested at his home in expensive, suburban Grosse Pointe, and the other is his father-in-law, Santo (Sam) Perrone, 56, an ex-convict whose police record dates back to 1920. Perrone is sought. Renda stood mute on arraignment and was placed under \$25,000 bail.

Clarence Jacobs, 48, of Tecumseh, Ont., was taken in custody in nearby Windsor, Ont., and O'Brien said that the fourth man named in the warrant, Peter Lombardo, 51, is serving five years in the federal penitentiary at

Millikan Tops Another Mark With Sabrejet

WASHINGTON (AP) — Col. Willard W. Millikan, National Guard flier who set an unofficial transcontinental air speed record on Saturday, duplicated his feat for a New York-to-Washington flight Tuesday.

National Guard officials said Millikan flew the 210 miles between Mitchell Field, Long Island, and Andrews Air Force Base, Md., in 24 minutes Tuesday, five minutes and fifteen seconds below the official record established in 1946.

Millikan flew the same F86 Sabrejet he used last week in his flight from Los Angeles, Calif., to Floyd Bennett Field, Brooklyn, in four hours, eight minutes and five seconds.
