Seven Linn Co. Officials To Run Again

ALBANY—Seven Linn County officials whose terms expire this year have announced intentions to seek re-election.

Included are State Sen. Warren Gill, Lebanon; Rep. Ed Cardwell, Sweet Home; and Jess Savage, Albany; District Attorney Courtney Johns; County Judge E. G. Arnold and County Commissioner Wayne Downing. All are Republicans.

Circuit Judge Victor Oliver, Albany, of the 21st judicial district, has indicated he will seek another term.

The primaries will be held May 21. Deadline for filing is March 12.

New Hubbard Mayor to Take Office Today

HUBBARD—Cyril McNary will be sworn in as mayor of Hubbard Friday evening January 8, and is the fourth man to be elected to that office in Hubbard since 1916 when the city's form of government first called for a mayor.

C. W. Maygar was first elected to that office and served nine years. Dr. A. F. deLospinasse and Garfield Voigt were other mayors. Six years ago Dr. deLospinasse was elected mayor, was re-elected twice and will swear in the new mayor for a two-year term.

Also to be sworn in are two councilmen, E. E. Piper and C. J. Friend, for two-year terms and Harold Abbott, treasurer, for a one-year term.

Services will be held at 2 p.m. Saturday at Clough-Barrick Chapel in Salem. The Rev. Paul Henry will officiate. Interment will be at Belcrest Memorial Park.

Ebner, Joe Wagner and William Blem; street-carl Mucken, Bernard Kirsch and Blem; finance - Wagner, Kirsch and Blem; health-Blem, Wm. Bean and Wagner; judiciary-Kirsch, Ebner and Blem; sewer-Kirsch Mucken and Wagner; public safety-Blem; chief of police, Merle Grace; city attorney, Douglas Harris; city judge-Phil May; health officer, Thomas Foster.

Two contracts were accepted by the council. One was the new franchise agreement with the Portland General Electric which doubles Mt. Angel's revenue and renewal of the contract with the Mt. Angel Fire district at the same figure as last year—\$2,000.

Fire Chief Schmidt reported one city fire during the past month and submitted a 1953 report which showed 28 fire calls for the year, 14 in the city and 14 in the rural district. Total fire losses amounting to \$688 and the time for fighting these fires four hours and 50 minutes for the city.

Silverton Area Fire Loss for 1953: \$43,700

SILVERTON—A total of 47 fires, 11 of them rural, were reported in the Silverton area for 1953 by Larry Carpenter, Silverton Volunteer Fire Department chief, Tuesday.

Estimated loss was \$43,700, of which \$30,000 was accounted for in the George Cafe and Johnson Delicatessen stores on North Water Street.

Carpenter also reported that 720 man-hours had been put in by the firemen and that 3,000 feet of 2½-inch hose, 1,650 of 1½ inch, and 4,000 feet of booster hose had been laid at fires as well as 1,060 feet of ladder hoisted.
