## Marines Plan Summer Camp At Coronado

Salem's U. S. Marine Corps Reserve, Third 155mm Gun Battery, will camp this summer at Troop Training Unit Pacific, Coronado, Calif., from July 25 through Aug. 7, it was reported Tuesday.
