## Hoover Asks U.N. Ban Kept On Red China

NEW YORK (AP) — Former President Herbert Hoover Sunday urged "every American" to join a petition campaign against admission of Red China to the United Nations.

"I have opposed recognition of Communist China by the United States and its admission into the United Nations from the day the Communists conquered China four years ago," Hoover said. "Any and every effort that we as Americans can make to prove to our friends overseas just where we, as a nation, stand, is of enormous value."

The petition signing campaign is being conducted by the committee for One Million which is headed by Warren R. Austin, formerly U. S. ambassador to the U. N.
