

Rev. Greene Arrives to Begin Ministry at Christian Church

The Rev. Wayne Greene, new pastor of the First Christian Church, will begin his ministry in Salem Sunday during the 10:45 a. m. service. He arrived here by plane Thursday.

He succeeds the Rev. Dudley Strain who recently accepted a call to Lubbock, Tex. The Rev. Donald Payne, interim pastor for past four months, will leave next week for Pendleton, Ore., where he has been called to the Christian Church.

The Rev. Greene, formerly of Beatrice, Neb., has held but three pastorates during his 25-year ministry. A graduate of Drake University, he has served churches at Kearney, Neb., and Liberty, Mo., as well as the Beatrice church. His 11-year tenure at the latter church is the longest in its history.

While in Beatrice he was active in Boy Scout work, president of the Kiwanis Club and is a member of the Masonic Lodge.

Mrs. Greene and her mother, Mrs. Sadie Johnson, had planned to arrive in Salem the first part of the week but Mrs. Johnson suffered a broken hip last Saturday and is in critical condition at a Beatrice hospital, the new minister said.

The Greens have two children, Mrs. Carl Hanley whose husband is studying for the ministry at the college of the Bible, Lexington, Ky., and Wayne Greene Jr., a sophomore at Drake University.
