# Pension Fund Changes Get Owners' Approval

NEW YORK (AP)—A joint committee of major league owners agreed Tuesday to recommend changes in the administration of the players' pension fund and to provide it with a fixed percentage of the income from the world series and all star games.

In a five-hour session the group agreed the fund should be run by a committee equally balanced between owners and players—two from each.

And it agreed that 60 per cent of the gross receipts from the all star game, including all star game radio and television contracts, and 60 per cent of the radio and television fees for the world series, should be paid directly into the pension fund.

J. Norman Lewis, attorney for the players' representatives and one of five men at Tuesday's meeting, estimated the financial change would provide an income of at least \$2,000,000 yearly starting after the 1956 season. He said the
