

Church Council Starts Migrant Program Plans

Many migrant workers who come to Marion and Polk counties for the harvest season this summer will find a program in operation designed to promote their spiritual and physical welfare.

Started in this community in 1953 by the Council of Churches, the migrant worker program will be expanded this summer, according to the Rev. Harold W. Black, pastor of the West Salem Methodist church and chairman of the local migrant committee.

Nearly a million people in this country have no homes other than the shabby tents or shelters where a crop is being harvested, he said, and the Salem area draws several thousand each summer.

Up to each individual community to outline a program to aid these persons in some way, the Rev. Black declared.

The program planned in Marion and Polk counties this summer will need the wholehearted support of all churches and social welfare groups in the community, he stressed.

Aid to migrant workers this season will include a medical clinic, day nursery for pre-school children, daily vacation Bible school, a sewing and washing center plus evening motion pictures and singing classes for both children and adults.

A meeting held this week to plan the project drew representatives from the Council of Churches, Ministerial association, Council of Church Women, employment service, county board of health, county juvenile office, county agent and county welfare department along with representatives of growers and industries that use migrant workers.

Working under the direction of the division of home missions of the National Council of Churches, the Salem Council of Churches has approved a \$900 budget for the season which will include five full-time social workers, the Rev. Black said.

However, for the program to succeed much of the work and money will have to be contributed by local community groups, he pointed out.

The program will be partly financed through the showing of the film "King of Kings" at the Elsinore theater during Holy Week. No admission will be charged but an offering will be taken at each showing.

In Independence Area
Slated to get underway on July 6 and continue through August, the migrant program will be conducted in the heavy bean producing area near Independence with other areas in the two counties being considered for similar projects.

Other activities being planned in conjunction with the migrant program include a rummage sale each Monday of the harvest season sponsored by individual churches and a rag doll project designed to bring a closer understanding between local residents and migrant workers, the Rev. Black said.

The migrant committee is working now to recruit volunteer helpers for the program of religious education, crafts, recreation and adult education, he explained.

At Trinity this week's service will be centered around "Thy Will Be Done," and at Immanuel around "Those Who Are Bitter."

"The Congregation and the Community's Leadership" will be the topic presented by John Overlund at the Men's Club Tuesday at 8 p. m. at Immanuel Lutheran church. Dr. R. J. VanCleave is program chairman.

Calvary Lutheran Church will hold services Sunday at 8 p. m. as well as the regular 11 o'clock morning service.

The School of Missions will continue through Sunday night at First Christian Church, with Charley Addelman, state secretary of missions, the speaker for the adult group, and Miss Betty Myers for the young people.

A mystery contest has been started at the Christian and Missionary Alliance Church Sunday School, with the mystery to be revealed on Easter Sunday.

A boys' night is planned for March 19 with the program sponsored by the Trinity Brotherhood. All Sunday School boys in grades three and older are invited to attend.

Brotherhoods of the Evangelical Lutheran Churches of Wilamette Circuit will meet at Faith Lutheran Church, Albany, Sunday afternoon at 3 p. m. to hear the Rev. Elling Ramsey, Portland recently named director of the chaplaincy service for Lutheran Welfare Association.

Group to Hear Ex-Missionary

Mrs. Elmer Boyer, missionary to Africa for over 30 years, will be the guest speaker at a meeting Thursday morning of the Christian Women's Fellowship of the First Christian Church.

The meeting is set for 11 o'clock in the church chapel.

Mrs. Boyer served in Africa under the auspices of the United Christian Missionary Society of the Disciples of Christ.

Following her address a luncheon will be held in the fellowship room of the church.

The color film "God Is My Landlord" will be presented during the Sunday evening service at the Englewood Evangelical United Brethren Church.

The film depicts the story of an experiment conducted by a man in Tecumseh, Mich., to test the principles of Christian stewardship. Starting with 360 kernels of wheat, the Michigan experimenter six years later harvested 72,150 bushels of grain.

Ex-Red Prisoner To Speak Sunday

The Rev. A. Kristian Jensen, Methodist missionary who spent three years as a prisoner of the Communists in North Korea, will tell of his experience at three services at the First Methodist church Sunday.

Scheduled to speak at 9:30 and 11 a. m. Sunday morning and again at 3 o'clock Sunday afternoon, he will speak of the faith and philosophy which kept him alive during the three-year period when food and medicine were meager and sanitary conditions non-existent.

Captured in June of 1950 at Songdo when the Communist forces first marched south in Korea, the Rev. Jensen was believed dead by his family and friends since nothing was heard of him during his imprisonment. He was released in May, 1953, at the "intervention of Soviet authorities in Moscow" and returned to the U. S.

At the time of her husband's capture, Mrs. Jensen was in Seoul, the Korean capital, and was able to escape to the free zone and later to America.

The Rev. Jensen first went to Korea as a missionary of the Methodist church in 1929 and in later years traveled widely as an observer of world affairs in Japan, North and South China, Malaysia, Syria, Palestine and Europe.

Although associated with several district superintendents of the Methodist church in Korea, his principal work was that of a rural evangelist.

Born in Denmark, the Rev. Jensen came to America in 1914 and was graduated from Cornell college, Iowa, and received his doctorate from the Boston University School of Theology.
