

### Judge to Rule On Thomson Case Soon

CORVALLIS — Judge Fred McHenry will decide next week whether to grant a new trial to Richard Thomson, Newport auto dealer, who has been sentenced to 20 years in prison for attempting to kill his partner, James Meuler. Arguments were presented here Saturday. Thomson's attorney, Mark Weatherford, argued that the court was in error in permitting during the trial reference to a plea of guilty which Thomson made, then withdrew. William Hollen, Lincoln County district attorney who prosecuted the case, argued that this and any other disputable evidence could have been attacked during the trial if the defense had so wished.

### James Frankland Forester, Dies

PORTLAND — James Frankland, chief assistant regional U.S. forester in charge of engineering here for many years until he retired in 1951, died from a heart attack Friday. Frankland had been with the Forest Service since 1911. His first job was with the Snoqualmie National Forest. He was born in Seattle and attended the University of Washington. Survivors include three sisters, Mrs. Bart Gagnon, Mrs. Henry Smith and Mrs. Jack Merriott, all of Seattle. Funeral services will be held here Tuesday.

### Rep. Norblad Eats With Ike, Presidential Aides

WASHINGTON — If trim-waisted Rep. Walter Norblad finds himself letting out his belt a few notches this weekend, he can pin the blame on the good cooking at the White House, where he enjoyed two pretty fair sized spreads within the past five days. Norblad had breakfast with President Eisenhower and 15 other members of Congress Thursday morning—a meal of bacon and eggs and grapefruit, followed by cigars and all the extra coffee he could handle. Tuesday he lunched with Eisenhower's assistant, Sherman Adams, in company with Rep. Harris Ellsworth (R-Ore.) and Rep. Hal Holmes (R-Wash.) and two other administration officials, including Budget Director Joseph Dodge. This noontime repast featured rib steak. Ike picks up the tab, of course, for his breakfasts with the lawmakers; and Adams signed the check for Norblad, Ellsworth and Holmes. He cracked: "I'm just a poor presidential assistant, and Joe Dodge owns a

bank in Detroit—so he can pay for his own lunch." Interestingly enough, this luncheon was in a dining room below the presidential offices at the White House which is used by administration executives. They each must sign for their meals however, to be billed by the White House later. So there apparently is no free loading on the president by his staffers. Neither invitation seemed to Norblad designed to persuade him and his colleagues of anything the administration wanted in particular on Capitol Hill, as
