215,000 Expected For Eight Clashes

Rudy Regalado of Cleveland; Bill Skowron of the Yanks; Alex Grammas, Tom Alston and Wally Moon of St. Louis; and Bob Talbot, Ernie Banks and Gene Baker of the Chicago Cubs.

Stengel is counting on Whitey Ford, who was being blasted a week ago for being poorly conditioned, as his starter against Washington. Old Case won't announce a definite starting lineup until Tuesday, waiting for Bucky Harris to name a definite pitcher.

Even if he did, he probably would change the batting order five minutes before the game anyhow. Harris may go with left-handed Chuck Stobbs although he refused to go beyond naming Stobbs or Bob Porterfield. A crowd of 30,000, plus like is expected.

Cleveland and Chicago, generally expected to give the Yanks the most trouble, play at Chicago before 30,000 with Early Wynn slated to work for the Indians against lefty Billy Pierce of the White Sox.

Detroit probably will have the day's largest crowd, 40,000, for the Tigers' opener against the Baltimore Orioles, who have replaced the St. Louis Browns as a "Western" club in the American League.

Steve Gromek, who flourished with Detroit after he was traded by Cleveland last year, gets the big assignment while Jimmy Dykes of the Orioles is undecided between Duane Pillette and Don Larsen, a pair of right-handers.

Mel Parnell, Boston's ace southpaw, will do the honors for the Red Sox before 12,000 fans at Philadelphia. Bobby Shantz, trying to come back after a disastrous season, will pitch for the renovated A's, who probably will start new men at six positions.

The Dodger-Giant game in the Polo Grounds probably will attract 35,000 with Carl Erskine, the Brooks' World Series strikeout pitcher, pitted against Sal Maglie, usually a Dodger killer.

Bob Buhl, who enjoyed such a successful season last year as a rookie, will open for Milwaukee against Bud Podbielan at Cincinnati, where the usual sellout of 30,000 plus is assured.

In St. Louis where the fans yelled "Where's old Enos?" at a welcome home parade Monday, the Cardinals will send Harvey Haddix against Chicago's Paul Miner in a battle of lefthanders. They expect 18,000 at Busch Stadium.

Robin Roberts, rocked in his spring starts, will try to get down to business for the Phillies at Pittsburgh, where Bob Friend will be his opposition before 20,000 or less.

Harris Sounds Horn

WASHINGTON (AP) — Bucky Harris, one of baseball's less outspoken citizens, spoke up Monday. He said his Washington Senators are a real threat for the American League pennant.

This is how Harris summed it up at a Touchdown Club luncheon honoring the Washington baseball team:

the mastery these two have held over the huge, testing Augusta National Course in six years.

It was the first head-to-head meeting between these two, tabbed by Bobby Jones as "the two greatest golfers in the world" since 1950. And they went at it like a pair of cagey veterans, each fully aware of the other's ability. For the most part they were content to play par golf, hoping to get one birdie when it counted.

Snead was the one who got it—on the 13th hole, where many fine golfers have blown themselves right out of the tournament.

It was on the 13th Sunday that Billy Joe Patton, the amateur sensation of this year's tournament, took a painful seven that cost him a victory. Patton was a member of Monday's gallery of some 7,000.

The 13th was the deciding hole and when Hogan three-putted the short 16th, Sam's victory seemed assured. But it wasn't until Snead came out of a trap within putting distance of the last hole that the crowd really relaxed.

After they had turned the first nine all even, Snead went ahead for the first time when he holed a sensational chip shot from off the edge of the tenth green. Hogan got that one back on the 12th and they came to the "graveyard" 13th.

This is a 470-yard, par five hole with a sharp dogleg around some woods to the left. A creek winds in a deep ditch along the left side of the fairway, crosses in front of the green and bends around the right side of it.

Hogan, hitting first, elected to play safe. He drove to the right of the fairway and played a safe shot short of the creek.

But Sam elected to gamble. He slammed his drive close to the trees on the bend, took an iron and fired a long, low shot to the green some 35 feet past the pin. Hogan's chip was weak and stopped on the front fringe of the green.

Snead, who has a reputation as a shaky putter and who admitted to the worst case of "yips" in his career before this tournament started, made an almost perfect putt. It came so close to dropping for an eagle that his lanky negro caddy, holding the pin, bent down to the ball and waved it on.

Hogan, putting from the fringe, couldn't get down and Sam tapped his one-footer in for a birdie that put him ahead to stay.

Up to that time, it had been anybody's match, but with the holes running out, the pressure was on Hogan.

NBA Ratings List Ex-Champ Charles 'Logical Contender'

WASHINGTON (AP) — Ezzard Charles, the old pro among the world's heavyweight boxer, won a "logical contender" label from the National Boxing Assn. Monday.

Charles, who will meet titlist Rocky Marciano for the championship June 17 at New York's Yankee Stadium, thus became the first boxer to earn such a high rating since Marciano won the title from Jersey Joe Walcott.

Nino Valdez, Cuba's hope for the championship, was listed as the best of three "outstanding boxers." Running behind Valdez were Don Cockell, the British champ, and Roland LaStarza, beaten within the past year by both Marciano and Cockell.

The No. 1 challenger role among middleweights was allotted to Rocky Castellani. Joey Giardello, who is expected to get the next shot at Bobo Olson's crown, was listed behind Castellani.

Randy Turpin of England, former middleweight champion, was listed third among the three logical contenders.

Once again the NBA exhorted Archie Moore, the light-heavyweight titlist, to defend his championship against Harold Johnson. Johnson, a Philadelphian, has laid claim to the title on the ground that Moore has refused to fight him.

The NBA listed Johnson as the only logical contender among the light-heavyweights. Jimmy Slade, who fights Moore in a non-title bout in May, was rated behind Johnson with former champ Joey Maxim behind him.

The NBA said it elevated Charles to a logical contender role because of his recent convincing victories over Coley Wallace and Bob Satterfield.

Shortstop Gene Tanselli remained unsigned Monday and must be classed as a holdout.

"We've talked with Gene and we want him back," Luby reported, "but we can't get together on salary terms. We've offered him a better contract than he had with us last season. His demands are more than we feel we can handle financially, and the next move is up to him."

Tanselli worked out with the club Monday.
