Luncheon for Volunteers On Monday

Annual luncheon meeting of the Marion County Public Health Nursing advisory committee, composed of volunteers working with the nurses in the county, was held Monday noon at China City. The meeting was held in conjunction with the polio emergency volunteers of the local chapter of the National Foundation of Infantile Paralysis.

Over 170 attended the luncheon including a number of special guests representing the Marion County board of health, the local infantile paralysis chapter, the Marion-Polk County Medical Society and the Salem and Marion County schools.

Mrs. Dean Bishoprick of Woodburn, chairman of the public health nursing advisory committee, presided. The main speaker was Mrs. Frederic Young, chairman of the women's activities division for the state chapter of Infantile Paralysis. She was introduced by Mrs. David Wright, chairman of the women's activities division of the local chapter. Mrs. Young told of the discovery of the Dr. Jonas Salk polio vaccine, which has been the dream of the polio foundation for many years.

Mrs. Adam LeFor, superintendent of nurses of the Salem Memorial Hospital, explained the pending training course for polio emergency volunteers, which will be held April 14, 15 and 16 at the Salem Memorial Hospital chapel.

Mrs. Spaulding Elected... Mrs. Harmon Yeary, director of public health nurses for Marion County, diagrammed the role of the volunteers in the pending polio vaccine clinics to be held in Marion County in the near future.
