

Solons Differ on Military Funds to Meet Asia Crisis

WASHINGTON (AP) — Two key senators expressed conflicting views Wednesday on whether the Eisenhower administration will ask Congress for more defense funds in view of the critical situation in Southeast Asia.

Chairman Ferguson (R-Mich.) of a Senate appropriations subcommittee told the Senate the administration has no plan "at present" to ask for a hike in the 30-billion-dollar budget.

But Sen. Maybank (D-SC), a subcommittee member, said Asst. Defense Secretary John A. Hannah told the subcommittee the administration will "probably" seek more money to cope with developments in the troubled Far East.

Maybank predicted Pentagon officials will ask for a stepped-up defense budget "as soon as they can."

Figures Remain
Ferguson told the Senate: "I do want to say there is not at the present time an anticipation

of a (defense) deficiency bill. The budget figures are as indicated." A deficiency bill is the usual method of seeking more money when it appears that actual expenditures, in an emergency, will exceed earlier expectations.

Ferguson said that "naturally" there has been a change in the global picture since the budget was made up last summer, but he declared:

"No Evidence"
"The senator has no evidence to indicate there will be an application (from the administration) for a deficiency bill to increase the amount of the present request."

Disagreeing, Maybank said: "I don't understand that from Hannah. I know there will be a deficiency bill if the Secretary of State and the Secretary of Defense make any agreements or arrangements for new defense policies in Southeast Asia," and he added: "That is going to cost money, plenty of money."

Maybank referred to Secretary

of State Dulles' plan for the United States to join with other free world countries in a "united front" against communist aggression in Southeast Asia, somewhat similar to the North Atlantic treaty setup in Europe.

Malik Rejects Charges. But Envoys Ousted

LONDON (AP) — Soviet Ambassador Jacob Malik rejected Wednesday British charges that two red air force majors on his staff were guilty of attempted espionage. But Malik said the two would leave Britain as ordered.

Malik called on British Minister of State Selwyn Lloyd to talk over the case of Maj. Ivan Pupyshov and Maj. Andrei Gudkov, assistant air attaches at the Soviet Embassy.

Last Saturday the British accused them of trying to ferret out military secrets and gave them 10 days to leave the country. A Foreign Office spokesman gave no details but said no atomic information was involved. It was believed the Russians were after British air secrets.

The London Evening Star said Col. Afanasi Marakazov, the second in command of the Soviet four-man military air staff here, had been recalled and would leave with Pupyshov and Gudkov. There was no confirmation.

Eugene to Study Future of Millrace
EUGENE (AP) — A study of the future of Eugene's millrace will be made by a committee to be appointed by Mayor V. Edwin Johnson.

He was instructed by the City Council to name citizens, council members and university officials to the committee after Councilman Calvin Crumbaker said it would cost from \$143,000 to \$301,000 to restore the stream completely. Crumbaker said the city had paid about \$58,000 over the past four years in millrace improvements and maintenance.

K of C to Open State Meeting
BAKER (AP) — The Knights of Columbus will open a state convention here Friday.

A special guest and speaker will be William Burke, Utica, N. Y., supreme director of the Knights. Attending will be state officers, eight district deputies, seven chairmen of special committees, two delegates from each of the 38 Oregon councils, and many members of the Knights.
