

West Coast Millworkers Vote to Strike

PORTLAND (AP) — AFL Lumber and Sawmill Workers of the West Coast are voting in favor of a strike to get contract demands, their newspaper, the Union Register, said Thursday.

"Substantial" votes favoring a strike if necessary to get a 12 1/2-cent hourly pay increase were reported from the North Idaho-Eastern Washington, Willamette Valley, Puget Sound, Everett and Coos Bay districts.

Employees of the plywood and door division of Simpson Logging Co. at McCleary, Wash., voted 9-1 for a strike, their business agent P. H. Moltz, reported Thursday. A number of locals still are to vote. Among these are large locals at Tacoma and Roseburg, which have set their balloting for Saturday and Sunday.

Earl Hartley, president of the Puget Sound council, said the vote there was running 5-1 for a strike.

The CIO International Woodworkers already have approved a strike in support of the same wage demand but they postponed a May 3 strike and went back to negotiations which thus far have been fruitless.

Employers have offered only to renew existing contracts.

PORTLAND (AP) — Three persons suffered minor injuries in a fire that caused an estimated \$20,000 damage to a two-story frame apartment house in North Portland Thursday.

Emanuel Jorge, 78, suffered burns on his face and hands, but managed to escape from his apartment through a window. Another occupant, Mrs. Irene Young, suffered shock. A fireman needed several stitches to close a cut in his hand from falling debris.

The fire was blamed onto a defective stove pipe.
