

Defenses Crushed By Vietnam Rebels

HANOI, Indochina (AP)—A force of 2,000 Communist-led rebels overwhelmed 1,000 Vietnamese troops and Catholic militiamen in a battle Thursday climaxed by a bloody seven hour last stand in a Roman Catholic seminary.

Logger Wins Suit Against Logging Firm

A Marion County Circuit Court jury unanimously awarded a Falls City logger a judgment of \$1,600 Friday evening after deliberating a case for about four hours.

Plaintiff in the case which began Thursday morning was Ward K. Richardson, a logger from Falls City.

Richardson had originally sought a judgment of \$2,143 for logs he allegedly delivered to Stebo Company, Inc., a Vancouver, Wash., logging firm. The case went to the jury about 4:30 p.m. Friday and they returned their verdict shortly after 3 p.m.

The trial was heard by Judge Robert Clapperton, of Portland, who is on the bench pro tem June 1-9.

Guard Found Dead; Believed Suicide Victim

A middle-aged man, identified as Raymond O. O'Neill Jr., 554 Mill St., was found dead early this morning on a dead-end road west of Salem, apparently a suicide victim.

O'Neill apparently shot himself with a rifle. The Rev. Harold J. McIntire, 4130 Glendale Rd., who identified the body, said O'Neill had recently been helping him with the construction of a new Church of God church. He said the man had been despondent over domestic affairs.

The dead man has been employed as a prison guard but was believed to be on vacation.

41 U. S. Cities To Be 'Atomic Bomb' Targets

WASHINGTON (AP)—Forty one American cities will be targets of a hypothetical atomic attack on June 14-15.

In announcing the first nationwide civil defense exercise, the Federal Civil Defense Administration said in a statement Friday night the purpose of the exercise is to increase the operational capabilities of all civil defense organizations.

The exercise, designated "Operation Alert," will also test communications facilities and provide realistic training for civil defense workers.

Cities selected as targets of the hypothetical attack, listed by states, include:

California — Los Angeles, Oakland, San Francisco, San Diego, Oregon — Portland, Alaska — Anchorage, Juneau, Washington — Seattle.

Argentina Labor Riots Fatal to Two

BUENOS AIRES, Argentina (AP)—Violence erupted on the restive labor front here Friday and unofficial reports said two workers were killed.

The reports said fighting flared at a meeting of striking metal workers. Police broke up the clash in which 30 persons were said to have been injured. There was no official report by police authorities.

Second Driver Contests Radar Arrest

Mrs. Dorothy Cheffings, 1185 N. 23rd St., joined the ranks of motorists protesting arrest by use of Salem police radar, contending that it is a violation of Oregon's "speed-trap" law.

Mrs. Cheffings' case went before Municipal Judge Douglas Hay Friday and the decision was taken under advisement.

This is the second case of this kind to be taken under advisement by the court since radar came to Salem. The first was that of Mrs. Evelyn J. Franz, 4400 N. River Rd., who was arrested by use of radar last Aug. 6. Mrs. Franz went before the judge Oct. 9 of last year, but no decision in the case has yet been made.

Both women are being defended by Lawrence Osterman and Reginald Williams, Salem attorneys. Osterman said Friday that the basis of defense is the same in both cases.

The attorneys contend that the radar apparatus actually measures a minute section of the wave-length emitted by the transmitter. Thus, they claim, the distance the car travels is measured and computed. The state's speed-trap law, in effect, prohibits the marking off of a section of highway and the deliberate clocking of motorists there by police officers.

In both cases the prosecution has maintained that the beams emitted by radar instantaneously record the speed of an automobile. They argue that the auto is not clocked over a measured distance.

Judge Hay said Friday evening that his decision has necessitated considerable study into many elements of electronic vs. legal interpretations. He said he thought a decision might be forthcoming within a week.

Labor, Welfare Budgets Okehed

WASHINGTON (AP)—President Eisenhower's request for \$1,965,285,261 to run the labor and welfare departments during the fiscal year starting July 1 was cut less than 1 per cent in a bill sent to the House floor Friday by the appropriations committee.

The committee approved \$1,948,946,011, or \$16,339,250 less than the President sought. As a result of the combined pruning by the White House and the committee, the agencies covered will receive \$302,243,250 less than they were voted this year, although some of the cuts may have to be made up later by supplemental appropriations.
