

Bank to Raze Ex-Home of Capital Journal

The former Capital Journal building, 444 Chemeketa St., is to be razed Aug. 1 to make room for future expansion of the First National Bank facilities, according to a report Monday by A. A. Atherton, vice-president manager of the bank.

The 20-year-old building was recently purchased by the First National Bank of Portland from Bernard Mainwaring.

Mainwaring had purchased the property from George Putnam in 1933 and the building was vacated when The Oregon Statesman and The Capital Journal merged this year. The structure had been offered for sale to the city by Mainwaring but the proposal was voted down in the May primary election.

The building was to have been used as an auxiliary space for police offices and is now occupied by the J. Henry Helsler Company which is awaiting completion of their offices at the Shrock building. The Journal building area will be temporarily used as a parking lot.

Cancer Claims 15-Year-Old Salem Girl

Fifteen-year-old Lucille Brewer, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Chauncey M. Brewer, 4345 Sunnyside Rd., died Sunday at a Portland hospital following an illness of the past six months.

Services will be held at St. Paul's Episcopal Church Wednesday at 2 p.m. with the Rev. George Swift officiating and interment at Belcrest Memorial Park.

Her father explained that the girl, a senior at Leslie Junior High School, and slated for graduation from there with the class of 1954, fell victim to a rare form of cancer last January. She underwent months of treatment, but her condition became consistently worse. She was a member of the Order of Rainbow for Girls.

Survivors, besides the parents, include a sister, Mrs. R. P. Greene, Medford, and a brother, Wendell Long, Salem.

Hop Growers Seek Plan for Marketing

Some of the county's hop growers are renewing their interest in a hop commission or some other combine effort at marketing. Marion County Farm Bureau's board of directors was told Monday night at a meeting in the Oregon Farm Bureau Federation of offices.

The board under new president Clarence Zielinski talked hops with a three-man Silverton delegation and agreed to study the problem and possibly call a hop growers' meeting on the subject.

A budget committee was appointed with Homer Goulet, Wacunda, as chairman.

Referred to the local Farm Bureau was a proposal from Baker County's organization that state and federal legislation be sponsored to permit closer checking on how welfare funds are spent under the aid-to-dependent-children program.

Supreme Court Upholds Check On Lobbyists

WASHINGTON — The Supreme Court Monday upheld the constitutionality of provisions in the 1946 law which require congressional lobbyists to register and file financial reports.

To rule otherwise, Chief Justice Warren said in delivering the 5-3 decision, "would be to deny Congress in large measure the power of self-protection."

The court ended its term with Monday's session and adjourned until next Oct. 4.

Hillary Leading Trek Out of Nepal

NEW DELHI — Himalayan mountaineering sources said Sir Edmund Hillary, conqueror of mighty Mt. Everest, is leading his New Zealand expedition out of Nepal after a siege of pneumonia. Early monsoon storms cut short his efforts to climb still unscalped Mt. Makalu.

The sources said Hillary had successfully recovered from the pneumonia attack after a difficult descent from a camp 22,500 feet up the face of the 27,790-foot peak, to base camp.

McCarthy's Finances Given Long Scrutiny

DENVER — The U.S. commissioner of internal revenue said Monday an investigation by his agency into the financial affairs of Senator Joseph McCarthy ("R-Wis") will wind up within the next 60 days.

T. Coleman Andrews made the statement to reporters after a speech in which he confirmed that McCarthy's financial matters are being checked by internal revenue agents. Andrews said the investigation has been going on for many months.

Andrews said if tax-dodging is uncovered McCarthy would be treated "just like any other tax evader," and added: "He may be a senator but he has no immunity from paying all his taxes."

W.E. Eberhart, Ex-Fireman, Succumbs

Walter E. Eberhart, former battalion chief and member of the Salem Fire department for 31 years, died Sunday at the age of 62 years following an illness of the past two months.

Eberhart was a member of the First Christian Church, Capital Post 9, American Legion and Chemeketa Chapter 1, IOOF. During World War I he was a member of Company C, 63d Infantry.

Also surviving are sisters, Mrs. A. N. Stewart, Tangent, and Mrs. J. N. Chambers and Mrs. George Vogl, both of Salem.

Hoegh Leading In Iowa Vote

DES MOINES — Atty. Gen. Leo A. Hoegh settled into a two to one lead over his nearest opponent for the Republican nomination for governor as returns mounted in the feature race of Monday's Iowa primary election.

The voting ran light as both Democrats and Republicans selected many of their candidates for the general election without contests. Neither Sen. Guy M. Gillette, Democrat, nor Rep. Thomas E. Martin, Republican, had opposition for the senatorial choices.

The attorney general won the endorsement of Iowa temperance groups after he said he opposed legalizing the sale of liquor by the drink.

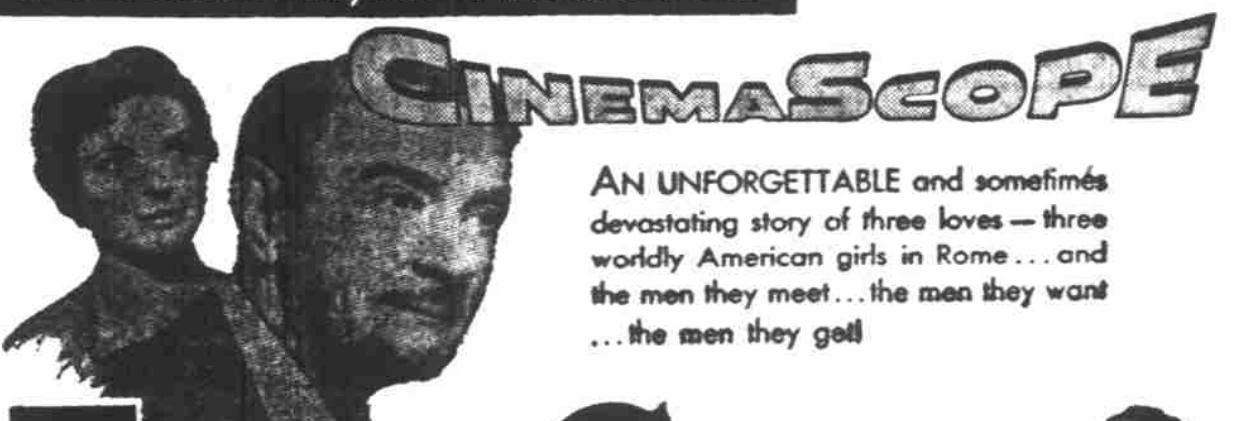
