Storm, Sewer Pump Bids Eyed by City

The city opened bids Friday on three pumps authorized in the new budget for sewage system improvements.

Fairbanks-Morse, bidding from Portland, submitted the low figures of \$8,365 for a 40,000-gallon storm pump at the city sewage treatment plant and \$590 each for two 400-gallon pumps to be installed in the new auxiliary sewage pumping station now under construction at South Church and Bellevue Streets.

The storm pump would be the third big pump in the treatment plant, for use when occasional heavy storms overtax the capacity.

City Engineer J. H. Davis' staff is analyzing bids, preparatory to making a recommendation to the City Council. Delivery dates and types of equipment are under study.

Other bidders: Worthington Corp., Seattle, \$9,016 and \$870; E. A. Finkbeiner, Portland, \$9,712 and \$1,488; H. D. Fowler Co., Inc., \$15,070 and \$1,269.

Three Portland firms bid on the two small pumps only: Pacific Pumping, \$757; Pacific Water Works & Supply, \$783; Pump, Pipe & Power Co., \$869.

Extra Curricular Activities to Get Workshop Study

A special summer workshop in extra curricular activities will be offered for the first time in Willamette university's summer session, beginning Monday, it was announced by Dr. George Martin, acting director of the eight-weeks' school.

Dr. Kenneth Lottick, associate professor of education, will be in charge of the four-week course which is designed to emphasize the study and development of individual problems relating to the supervision and programing of various extra school activities.

An advanced coaching methods workshop will be reintroduced for the first time since 1951. Under the direction of Athletic Director John Lewis and Jerry Frei, assistant football coach, the four-week course will stress the practical situations which confront coaches.
