CHAMPOEG—On this monument in the foreground are inscribed the names of the settlers who balloted with a margin of two votes to have the vast Oregon country come under the sovereignty of the United States instead of the British Empire. Champoe State Park veritably is the birthplace of Oregon. There are 52 names on the monument—those who voted for the U. S. more than a century ago. Building in background houses a museum and an open-side meeting place for pioneer societies. (On the Willamette River about 30 miles north of Salem via the North River Road).



Logging Harvest Sets New Mark

Loggers harvested approximately 9,802,471,000 board feet of logs from the timberlands of Oregon during 1952, estimated to be the largest cut in the logging history of the state.

Train Jaunt Offers Many Advantages

Modern, streamlined passenger equipment featured by many of the nation's railroads which have taken great strides toward making train travel more pleasurable for the leisurely vacation time traveler.

Newer cars, whether of the Pullman type featuring the luxury of private rooms, or coaches featuring economy plus comfort, are equipped with wide, double glass windows giving unrestricted views of the countryside.
