

75 Miles from Salem



PORTLAND—Multnomah Falls is the highest of any of the Oregon waterfalls, cascading 620 feet, including both drops, along the famed Columbia River Highway east of Portland where there are 11 waterfalls within 11 miles, all of them tumbling their waters into the nearby Columbia. (About 75 miles northeast of Salem via Portland and Highway 30).

Record Tourist Season Seen in Oregon

Oregonians look forward this year to entertaining what may well be the largest number of out-of-state visitors on record. And from reports about the state, accommodations, recreation facilities, and hosts in Oregon's variety of scenic regions are well prepared for the vacation season ahead.

An up-to-date accommodation survey shows several new resorts and improvements at many of Oregon's resorts already established.

Newly opened near Lapine is Elkhorn Lodge, offering new accommodations in the Upper De-

chutes-Crane Prairie fishing region in Central Oregon.

Lodge Enlarged

In Northeastern Oregon, Walla Walla Lodge has more than 200 new rooms ready for use on the edge of Walla Walla Lake. In the southern reaches of the Wallawas, Boulder Park Resort, the Eagle Creek region, makes the Eagle Creek region, makes 67 fishing lakes accessible by horseback and trail.

A special guest ranch for boys and girls, Rafter M-D Ranch, north of Klamath Falls has announced a long season, June 21-September 4.

Improvements are announced

at two other well-known Cascade resorts, Spring River, Box 472, Bend and Suttle Lake, Sisters, Oregon. Both are recently under new management.

New Accommodations

On the Oregon coast new accommodations and facilities are reported at Depoe Bay, Port Orford and Wecoma. One well-known Oregon coastal lodge has announced rates beginning as low as \$2.50 up to \$8.50.

For those who like to get off the beaten track, pack trips into the Cascade Mountains will be available this year at Breitenbush, Elk Lake, Crescent Lake, Lake of the Woods, Redmond and Mt. Hood. New mailing address

of Cascade Packers is Stayton, care of Gene Ware. Skyline Guide Service is at Redmond, Oregon.

New motels and motor courts reported recently include those at Bend, Heppner, Ontario, Lapine, LaGrande, John Day, Pendleton, and Portland. One new motel in Portland is a \$300,000 investment, containing 50 units.

Highways Greatly Improved

Oregon's highway system has undergone a great part of a \$72,000,000 improvement program during the past year. New sections include several on the Pacific Highway, including Divide to Anlauf and Medford to Ashland. New sections of the coastal highway, U. S. 101, include sections from Bay City to Tillamook, Newport to Toledo (U. S. 20) and Reedsport to Hauser.

Visitors will especially appreciate the new sections of the Columbia River Highway, U. S. 30, which now runs at water level all the way from Portland to Rowena, eight miles west of The Dalles. For those who wish to see the gorge in more leisurely fashion, the scenic highway, running the route of the old highway is still maintained from Troutdale via the Vista House and Crown Point.

Many State Parks

State parks in Oregon are placed strategically throughout the state for public enjoyment. These include over 30 roadside picnic areas with signs at their entrances and a mile in advance for convenience of use. Improvements will be found this year at Hat Rock State Park, U. S. 730, near McNary; and on the coast at Beverly Beach, Cape Lookout, Honeyman, Big Creek, and Harris Beach State Parks. A new state park is to be opened this season at Blue Lake on Santiam Pass—it is named Elliott R. Corbett Memorial Park. The U. S. Forest Service has recently opened a new forest camp also at Detroit Reservoir called Lake shore. (Complete lists of state park camping areas and U. S. Forest camps may be obtained by writing Travel Information Division, Oregon State Highway Department, Salem.)

Visitors to Northeastern Oregon should not miss seeing Hells Canyon—the Grand Canyon of the Snake River—world's deepest cleft, either at Hat Point out of Enterprise and Joseph or by guided tours through the sponsorship of the Hells Canyon Tours of Baker.

Things to see in Southeastern Oregon include Owehee Reservoir and Wildlife Refuge, one of the country's largest and most interesting sanctuaries, south of Burns.

"Musts" in the Central Oregon region are the Painted Hills, northwest of Mitchell, the John Day Fossil Beds, along Oregon Route 19, north of Dayville, the huge juniper stands in the Bend-Redmond area and the recreation areas of the Crooked, Metolius, and Deschutes Rivers. Central Oregon's Cascade wonderland includes the primitive areas of the Three Sisters and Mt. Jefferson, and a huge realm of lake and stream resorts beginning at the Cascade divides and fringing the streams and lakes of the foothills.

National Attractions

Southern Oregon contains two of the national attractions of the state—Crater Lake National Park, open year around, via Oregon Route 62 and Oregon Caves National Monument, southwest from Grants Pass via U. S. 199 and Oregon 46. The lodge at Crater Lake opens June 15, and the chalet at Oregon Caves May 30. Other things to see in Southern Oregon are the historic remains of Jacksonville, queen city of the pioneer gold rush, the lush recreation-filled valleys of the Rogue and Umpqua and the immense Klamath basin, containing Ore-

gon's largest fresh water lake.

Visitors will not want to miss the flower parade that begins on the Oregon coast in April when the highways become lined with Scotch broom and Irish furee, nor will they want to miss the azaleas and rhododendrons in bloom in May and June.

Valley Attractive

In the Willamette Valley, it's fun to visit Oregon's Capitol at Salem, where guided tours are available daily. Silver Falls State Park east of Salem is one of the state's largest and most beautiful parks containing ten major waterfalls and connecting trails. At Portland, visitors thrill to the world's largest log cabin and logging museum, The Sanctuary of Our Sorrowful Mother, International Rose Test Gardens and Zoo at Washington Park. Miles of scenic drives, maps of which are available upon request at the Visitors' Information Center, Southwest Front and Main Streets, take Portland visitors to many other points of interest about the city.

Recreation on coast

The northwest coast of Oregon is a never-ending region of recreational pleasure containing such attractions as the Astor Column at Astoria, promenade and boardwalk at Seaside, Haystack Rock, and Needles at Cannon Beach, and miles of smooth, sandy beaches in North Tillamook and Clatsop County.

Lincoln County on the coast is particularly noted for its deep sea, surf and bay fishing facilities and for its many modern accommodations close to ocean and river recreation. And visitors come back again and again to see and enjoy things like fishing in Winchester Bay in Douglas

County; Sea Lions Caves, world's only mainland sea lion rookery in Lane County; the unusual myrtle groves and lumber ports of Coos county and the lower Rogue River and primitive areas of Curry County, land where flowers bloom the year around.

The Government Locks at Seattle are the largest in continental United States. Tourists enjoy watching pleasure craft, work boats and ships pass through the locks from the fresh water lakes to Puget Sound.
