

Salem Area Delegates To Girls State Selected

Six Salem area delegates to the annual Girls State, meeting this week on the Willamette University campus, won top offices in county and city elections held Tuesday. The program is sponsored by the American Legion Auxiliary.

Party conventions are scheduled today when candidates will vie for state offices. The general election will be held Thursday morning and inauguration ceremonies for the newly elected governor will follow on Thursday afternoon.

Bankers Elect H. E. Shelton

GEARHART — The Oregon Bankers Assn., holding its annual convention here Tuesday, elected H. E. Shelton of Forest Grove as president.

Shelton also was named a member of the nominating committee of the American Bankers Assn. John B. Roberts, Baker, was elected alternate to the nominating committee. A. W. Growth and A. L. Powers, both Portland, were re-elected directors of the Pacific Coast Banking School.

The association also approved a resolution calling for congressional and executive action to get the government out of business operations which compete with private enterprise.

Urged co-operation in programs for the sale of U. S. savings bonds.

Heard a report that Oregon banks favored Saturday closing by a vote of 4-3.

Springfield To Decide on Power Policy

SPRINGFIELD, Ore. — The Springfield City Council may decide soon whether to try to buy Pacific Power & Light Co. holdings here or to sell out the city's competing power system.

The City Utility Board reported Monday that it was costly to the community to have duplicate power facilities. Mayor Edward C. Harms Jr. was authorized to appoint a five man committee to study the problem.

"We must decide whether we should sell out or whether we should buy out," Councilman Arthur McChesney said.

The municipal power system was started 3½ years ago in competition with what was Mountain States Power Co., since merged with Pacific Power & Light.

The municipal power system now claims to serve more than half the residences in Springfield, but says it markets only about 20 per cent of the power sold to business firms.

Chinese Talk Of Releasing Yankees Early

GENEVA — Red China promised the United States Tuesday to consider the early release for good behavior of a number of Americans imprisoned by the Peiping regime.

Eighty-three Americans—54 civilians and 29 military personnel—are listed as either in Chinese prisons or unable to obtain visas to leave China. More than 30 are estimated to be in prison.

Among Americans known to be in Chinese hands are two news correspondents, Richard Applegate of Medford, Ore., and Donald Dixon of New York. They were seized in a yacht off Macao in March 1953, along with a merchant marine captain, Ben Krasner of Brooklyn.

Also held by the Chinese is civilian air line pilot Lawrence Bul of Stockton, Calif., held since January, 1950, and an American jet ace, Capt. Harold Fischer of Swea City, Iowa, shot down in the Korean war. Missionaries and businessmen make up most of the remainder.

Youth Directs Armed Robbery Of His Father

INDIANAPOLIS — A 16-year-old youth told police Tuesday that he directed the armed robbery of his father by another youth and even ordered his companion to "shoot him and get it over with."

Detective Sgt. Harold Goodman said William Dale Miller stated he stood outside the filling station where his father worked Monday night and told a friend who went inside.

"Put a gun in his belly and keep it there. Don't give him no chance. Shoot him and get it over with."

The companion did not shoot but took \$100 from Herbert Miller, 46. Miller told police he recognized his son's voice, and the arrest and questioning of the son led also to the arrest of Kenneth Amhurst, 17.

Haile Selassie At Yosemite

INDEPENDENCE — Funeral services for William McCallister, 87, native of Oregon and son of a pioneer family, will be held at 1:30 p.m. in the W. T. Rigdon Chapel in Salem. He died Monday at a rest home in Independence.

Born at Sodaville, near Lebanon, in 1867, he was the son of Daniel and Anna McCallister, early day residents of the community. With the exception of a few years spent in mining fields in Idaho, McCallister had lived all his life in Oregon. He had worked in the logging industry in the Salem area and in southern Oregon and for a time was employed by the U.S. Forest Service.

Survivors include one sister, Mrs. Steve Baulch of Silverton, and one nephew, Leo McCallister of Salem.

Concluding services will be held at the Mt. Hope Cemetery.

Southeast, Midwest in Heat Wave

Much of the Midwest and Southeast simmered in a steamy June heat wave Tuesday that spawned tornadoes and thunderstorms along its western edge.

The weather was cool in New England, moderate and dry in the northern plains, warm and sunny in the Southwest and cloudy and showery in the Northwest.

The heat wave reached record-breaking proportions in Chicago when the mercury touched 93 degrees. It was the highest reading for the date and marked the first time in Weather Bureau history the city has had five consecutive June days of 92 degrees or higher.

Tornadoes spun down from the skies in Northwestern Missouri, and in Central Kansas. No damage was reported from either twister.

A heavy thunderstorm doused Dubuque, Iowa, with 2½ inches of rain and hail in less than an hour and winds rose to 60 m.p.h.
