Bill to Slash Taxes Given Senate Floor

WASHINGTON—The Senate Finance Committee voted late Friday to send to the floor an omnibus tax revision bill carrying \$1,477,000,000 in reductions for corporations and individuals in its first year of operation. The measure is almost exactly in the form asked by President Eisenhower and carries practically all of the major provisions of the House bill. It is one of the must items on the administration's 1954 legislative program.

Morse Raps Program on Atom Power

WASHINGTON—Sen. Morse of Oregon said Friday it would be a "great mistake" for the federal government to give private industry "carte blanche" control over atomic energy power development. A bill now is pending in the Senate House Atomic Energy Committee to permit private industry to own reactors or atomic energy power plants, under government regulation.
