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STAYTON — Funeral services for Matt Bieber, 60, Milwaukee, will be held at 10 a.m. Friday in the Immaculate Conception Catholic Church here under the direction of the Weddle Funeral Home.

Bieber died unexpectedly of a heart attack at his home in Milwaukee Tuesday. He was born April 17, 1894 at Manfred, N. D., and grew to manhood there. A farmer in his native state until he moved to Milwaukee about 12 years ago, Bieber recently had worked in a cannery in Stayton.

First prize in the two-month contest was won by J. D. Ross, Corvallis, who entered a 25 15/16 inch Dolly Varden caught on May 1 on the south fork of the McKenzie River. His prize was a 5-HP outboard motor valued at \$203.

Dick Cyphert, Valsetz, won a total of three sleeping bags with his entry of a 25 1/4 inch Rainbow caught June 27 on Klamath Lake. Two sleeping bags represented the second grand prize while the third was the prize for largest trout caught during the final week of the contest ending June 28.

The third major prize, a Mitchell spinning reel and a spin rod, went to Cyphert's fishing partner, Bill Thomas, also of Valsetz. Thomas entered a 25 1/16 inch Rainbow caught June 27 on Klamath Lake.
