

Cambodians to Ask Red Troops Retreat

Geneva (AP) — A six-man Cambodian military group arrived here Monday prepared to demand the retreat of Communist-led Vietnamese troops from the Indochina kingdom's territory.

The group, headed by Gen. Nhiek-Tiouloung of the Cambodian general staff, told correspondents on arrival Cambodia's only aim was the "protection of our frontier from invading forces."

No Postage On Airmail From Camp

Two Salem lassies, sojourning at the Brownie Girl Scout encampment at Camp Silver Creek, employed the air lanes to message their parents Monday—but no postage was required.

The means of conveyance was a carrier pigeon, owned by Tom Pomeroy, 2935 Rivercrest Dr. Pomeroy raises and trains the birds as a hobby.

When Pomeroy's daughter, Kathy, left for camp recently with Brownie troop 31, she took six of the pigeons along for mail purposes. Three of the birds were loosed Monday at the camp, one with messages from both Kathy and girl friends Phyllis Hill, of 1060 Greenwood Dr.

All three birds safely completed the flight of approximately 20 air miles. Pomeroy calculates it took the pigeons about an hour to fly the distance.

In her message, Kathy specifically requested a camping knife. But that item will require postage. Carrier pigeons aren't quite up to packing freight.

4 Missing at Boys School

Four escapees from MacLaren Boys School were reported to State police Monday night.

First listed as missing were Charles Leroy Fender, 16; Arthur Bobb, 17; and John Henneman, 14. They were presumed to have left the school together. A later escapee reported was Richard Douglas James, 17.

State Penitentiary Lacking in Tailors

Operations of the state penitentiary tailor shop have been slowed down because there are not enough tailors in the institution, prison warden Clarence Gladden reported to the State Board of Control.

"Unless we receive more tailors it may be necessary to employ one or two tailor journeymen," Gladden said.

A resident of the Salem area for the past two years, he was born in London, England in December of 1877. Mr. Clark for many years was active in the plumbing and steamfitting trades.

Survivors include the widow, Mrs. Sophia Clark, Salem; a daughter, Mrs. Myrtle Dodge, Salem; and a son, Cy J. Clark, Palo Alto, Calif.

Funeral services will be held at the Virgil T. Golden Co., chapel today at 2 p.m., with the Rev. John Cauble officiating. Private committal services will be at Mt. Crest Abbey Mausoleum.

Thief Fails in Swim Attempt

PORTLAND (AP) — Police, investigating the burglary of a hardware store earlier in the day, arrested a dripping wet man near the Sauvie Island Bridge in the north district Monday night.

They booked him on a burglary charge as Edward G. Judd, 30, a mechanic.

Sheriff's deputies R. W. Miller and Hal Lynn and city policemen said he told them he had tried to swim a river slough to avoid capture but gave up because of the cold water and returned to shore. They said they found stolen goods valued at more than \$2,000 in his car. These included guns, radios, outdoor motors and other sports equipment.

The weather was a little cooler in Oregon Monday as clouds moved over much of the western half of the state. Eastern sections had more hot weather, however, with Ontario's 96 degrees the highest reading in the state. Ontario had Sunday's high of 99.

It was 90 in Baker Monday, 89 in Medford and 86 at Redmond. Salem reported a high of 76 degrees, Portland had 75, and it was 77 in Eugene.

Forecasters said a low pressure area at high levels remains off the Oregon coast, and moisture in the air will cause varying amounts of cloudiness over Western Oregon Tuesday. Little change is expected in the moderate forest fire danger, forecasters said.
