

Ancients Used Filter Tips

OTTAWA, Ont. (AP)—About the time of the birth of Christ, Indians in northern Mexico were growing tobacco and smoking cigarettes with filter tips.

This is one conclusion of an Ottawa husband-and-wife team, back from Mexico with extensive material on the history of North American farming.

Dr. R. S. MacNeish, and his wife, June, anthropologists, found the remains of seven successive cultures in one cave.

One of the later groups grew tobacco and smoked it in tubes made of cut cane. Into some of the canes they introduced vegetable fibers, apparently to act as filters.

Stock Prices Close Mixed; Average Down

NEW YORK (AP)—The stock market traversed a cautious route of irregularity Thursday, its second session following two days of strongly advancing prices.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks lost 10 cents at \$129.30. The industrial component fell 40 cents, railroads remained unchanged, and utilities were up 10 cents at a new high mark of \$61.70.

There were 428 gainers and 459 losers out of the 1,186 individual issues traded with 93 new highs and 5 new losses for the year registers. Volume dwindled down to 2,000,000 shares, the 51st time this year that the two million mark has been crossed. That compares with 2,380,000 shares traded Wednesday when the average remained unchanged.
