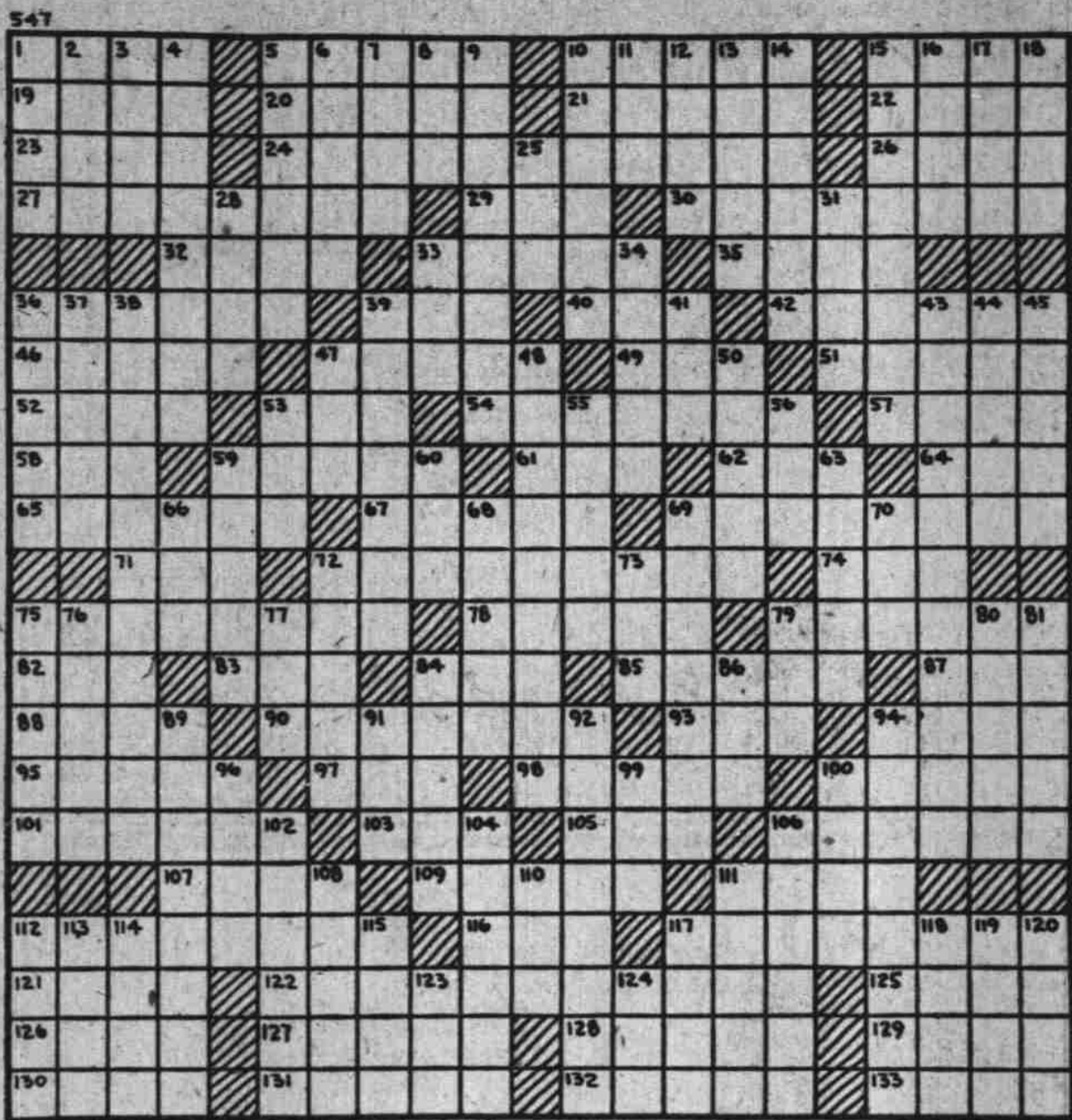

### Visit of French Heroine Stresses Need for Nurses

WASHINGTON — Mrs. Frances P. Bolton, Republican congresswoman from Ohio, says the prospective visit of the famed French nurse, Genevieve de Galard-Terraube, heroine of Dien Bien Phu, would aid in dramatizing the great shortage of nurses in this country.

Mrs. Bolton introduced a resolution in Congress to invite the intrepid young nurse to visit the United States. She says it was the first time in the history of Congress such action was taken.

The Ohio representative long has been interested in the nursing profession and during the war introduced the Bolton Act, which established the Cadet Nurse Corps and provided a government subsidy for graduate and undergraduate students in nurse training. In 1942 she was active in the passage of a bill by Congress equalizing the pay of Army nurses with that of officers of like rank.

Italian Ambassador Tarchiani, a party guest at Fort Meyer, Va., of the Army, chief of staff, Gen. Matthew B. Ridgway, looked out with amazement over the beautifully tended green lawns and big shady trees.

"You call this a fort?" he asked his host. "In Europe a fort is not pretty. Most often it is grim and unsightly. This is like a beautiful

park. Ft. Myer! This fabulous America."

Mrs. Koo, wife of the Chinese ambassador, has gone to France to reclaim the beautiful Paris residence which was taken from her during the occupation days of World War II.

The wife of Maj. Gen. Frank A. Allen Jr., who has traveled much in the Orient and was in Tokyo while her husband was assistant commanding general of the First Cavalry Division, is teaching some of her Washington friends the art of Japanese flower arrangements.

Mrs. Allen attended regular classes and had private lessons as well. She studied with the famed Houn Ohara, headmaster of the Ohara School of Japanese Flower Arrangement and also at the Saga School.
