Discussion to Review United Defense Fund

The program and needs of the national United Defense Fund will be reviewed in Salem today by Eli Fox, associate director of the public relations department of the organization.

Fox, who comes to Salem to meet with the staff and board of the Oregon Chest, will also meet this afternoon with the budget committee of the Salem United Fund to discuss the budgetary needs of his organization for next year.

The United Defense Fund is a federation of five agencies, of which the USO is the largest. Other agencies are the National Recreation Association, the National Social Hygiene Association, the United Community Defense Services and the United Seamen's Service.

It is, said Fox, impossible for the USO to meet anywhere near the demands made upon it by the national department of defense on its present operating budget. Fox stated that the UDF has been raising about eleven millions of dollars annually but must raise at least fifteen million to do anything like an adequate job.

Budget for the UDF for Oregon for 1955 is \$161,000 but the board of directors of the Oregon Chest, which is the fund raising agency for the UDF in this state, accepted only \$129,000.

Drag Races Considered for City Airport

A request to make the Salem airport available for auto drag races and further consideration of a long range airport repair program will occupy members of the city's Airport Advisory Committee at a meeting this morning in the city manager's office.

Three auto clubs, the Millers, Dicers and Bent Eights, have asked permission to stage drag races on one of the airport runways Sunday, Oct. 10. In drag races, the cars begin from a standing start.

The long range repair program has been suggested as a means of eliminating one major repair bill built up over a long period. As proposed in the program, repairs would be taken care of when needed.

The committee also will consider rules and regulations, found needed because of absence of a tower at the city airport for the past year. The Navy, active at the airport on weekends, has asked that planes be permitted to turn away from the city, instead of following the regular flight pattern used when a tower is not in operation.

Other items to be considered by the advisory committee this morning include an application by Richard Krenz for a 15-year lease for farming the airport. Krenz has had a five-year lease.

A rental agreement with George Kreitzberg of Kreitzberg Aviation will be studied and also to be discussed is a proposed air fair on August 29 at the airport.

Latest also will be heard on a building which the State Board of Aeronautics proposes to construct here.

The committee may take action on a request to rebuild one of the Air Police Squadron hangars.

Aid Sought on Missing Man By Red Cross

Marion County Red Cross officials are making a check on the whereabouts of Vernon Cavender, former cook in Bend who was reported to have left in recent weeks for Salem to work in orchards.

The request about Cavender, a man between 25 and 35, came from El Paso, Tex., where Red Cross has been helping his mother, Mrs. Jessie Cavender, locate her son. They were to have met in El Paso early this month. Meanwhile in Texas, the body of a drowning victim has been identified tentatively as Cavender's, but the Red Cross and police authorities there are continuing an investigation into the man's whereabouts.

Anyone who may have known Cavender in this area is asked to get in touch with Mrs. Lawrence Barnard, home service department head for the Red Cross Salem office.

Salem People Excel at Fire Prevention

Salem residents are better than average at employing fire prevention measures in their own homes, according to a survey made by city firemen under the direction of Chief Ellisworth L. Smith.

The survey was conducted during the month of June as a part of a state-wide home fire prevention program.

Figures released by Smith showed that of 2863 Salem homes inspected, 47.10 percent were found to have complied fully with all standard precautions. The state-wide percentage was only 33.09.

Checked during the survey were such items as ashes not in metal

containers, rubbish not properly taken care of, unsafe wiring, flammable liquids not properly stored, etc. Salem rated better than the state as a whole on all these items, according to Smith.

More than 43,000 inspections were made over the state during the June survey.

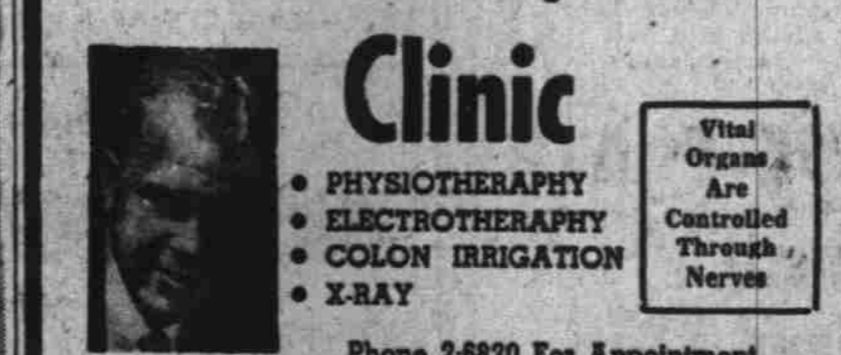
