Flood Project WASHINGTON (#) - Army Engineers Thursday urged approval of changes in the Amazon Creek flood control project near Eugene. Ore., to permit use of reinforced concrete rather than riprap in completing work on the remaining

5,800 feet of channel. A spokesman said the reinforced concrete would provide protection against the flood "that occurs maybe once every hundred years."

The Amazon Creek modification was one of two Oregon projects the engineers asked a Senate Public works subcommittee to be included in a forthcoming authoriza-tion bill. The other would protect Tillamook Bay and harbor from further damage.

The Amazon Creek work, as now proposed, would cost an additional \$350,000 including \$56,000 in local contribution.

The Tillamook project would close the breach in the Bayocean Peninsula by building a sand dike 1.4 miles long between Pitcher Point and Bayocean.

The project would cost \$1,775,060 of which local interests are to provide the equivalent of about
