Hearing Set For Dallas Girl Driver

DALLAS, Ore. — Preliminary hearing for Kathryn Mercer, 18, Dallas, who was found criminally negligent by a Polk County coroner's jury, will be held at 10 a.m. Monday before Justice of the Peace Kenneth Shetterly.

Miss Mercer was listed as driver of a car which crashed on June 4 following graduation exercises at Dallas High School. Claude Joseph Navaris, 15, was killed in the accident.

Purpose of the hearing is to determine whether the state has sufficient evidence to warrant an indictment. District Attorney Walter Foster will represent the state. Bruce Spaulding, Portland attorney, will represent Miss Mercer.

Monmouth Group Suggests Change In Street Name

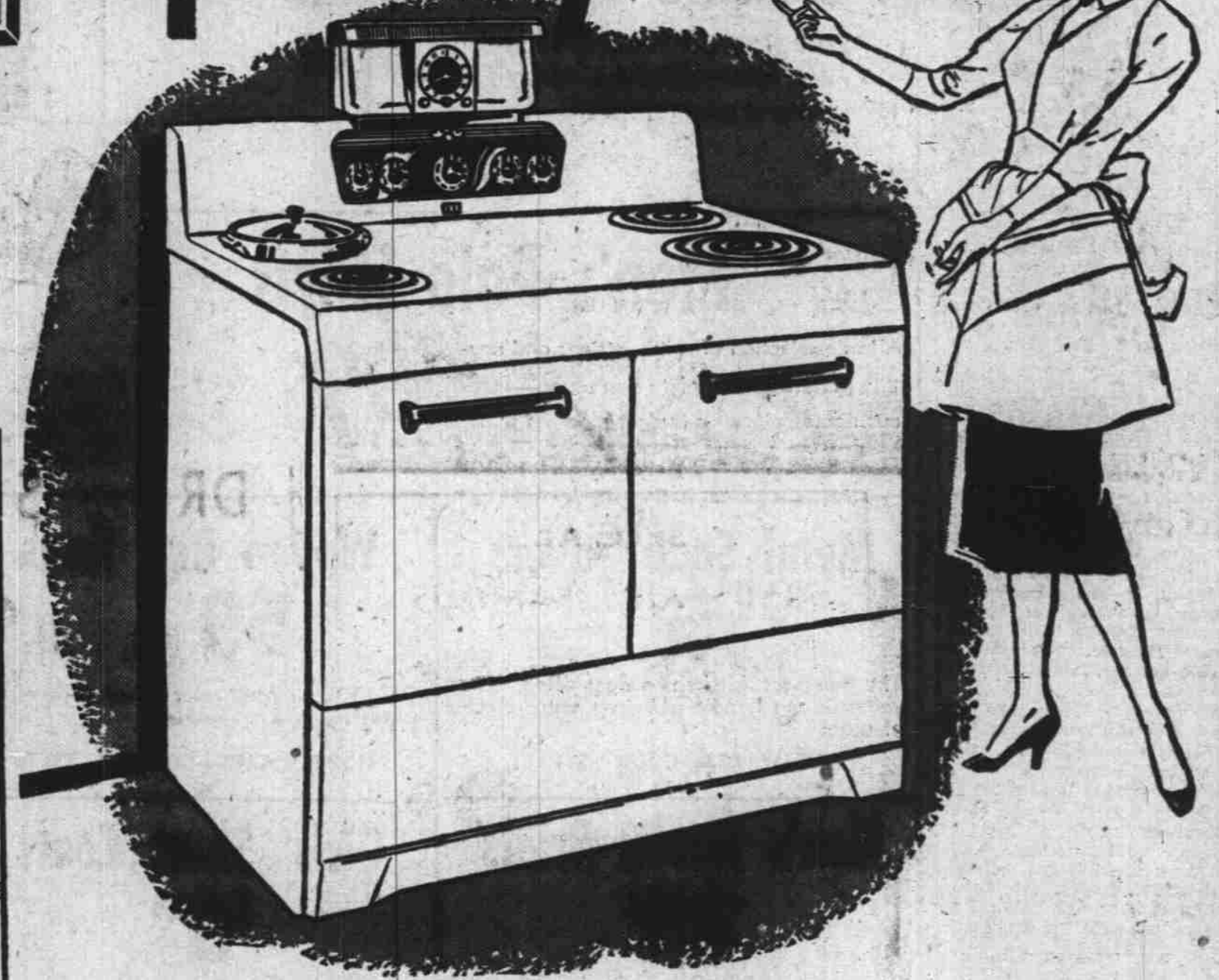
