Inside TV . . . New Zany Touted For Fame on TV

HOLLYWOOD — NUTS AND BOLTS DEPARTMENT: We believe there's room for one, if only one, completely whacky TV show on a national scale. We mean the kind of stuff that first made Henry Morgan famous on radio, the impossible humor and antics of one Hawthorne here in Hollywood.

Morgan began to spew forth the zaniest kind of chatter, music and sound effects shortly after the war, and went on to zoom like a skyrocket through the entertainment field. Unfortunately, the peak of his career was about as brief, squelched, we suspect, by his murderous imitation one night of a potent Hollywood personality. The personality proved more than his match in influence and Morgan was left flat on the canvas in a remarkably brief round. Since then he's trickled back via TV panels and a few motion pictures, but his original alleged humor remains in memory as good as it ever was. We've long hoped for some other chap with a warped sense of humor to take up where Morgan left off—shying very clear of Hollywood personalities, of course.

Hawthorne might well be the man. We think he's a human male, although there's never been, on radio or TV, any certain evidence offered. He's short, rounded, crew cut and horn rimmed, and also about as clever in his most peculiar field as Morgan himself. Possibly better.

Hawthorne ran a short radio spot a long while before TV let him in, via a brief 15-minute go at the weather. Obviously the weather reports must come to him by a plain, garden-variety telephone, but he presents them with the aid of a Rubie Goldberg contraption which squirts snow, tickler tape and ghastrly moans and shudders. Constantly permeated by a running gag, Hawthorne's weather report has at times been some of the craziest humor this side of a nut house. Inmates of the latter are the only ones who could possibly fully understand Hawthorne, but we all appreciate him no end. And now he's been given a longer, later spot on TV locally in which to cavort and confuse and laddle up gags which could only breed beneath his short-cropped thatch.

Did you know that automobile manufacturers are the biggest sponsors of network shows this fall. They're spending \$41,850,000 in time and talent so far. . . . Britain has 3,300,838 television sets as of May 1. . . . Ruthie Gilbert expects an heir around the first of the year but this will not prevent her from continuing as "Maxie" on the Milton Berle Show (NBC) next season. . . . And the Ford tells us to color this fall. . . . Motion picture talent scouts tell me they do most of their sleuthing for new talent in front of their TV sets. . . . And Red Skelton, noting a hefty doll in slacks, remarked, "She's living way beyond her seams."
