## Transfers Boost Bevos; Ducks in Good Shape

CORVALLIS (P)—Oregon State got its football workouts under way Wednesday with eight transfers boosting the turnout to 56 men. Five of the transfers are ball carriers, a sorely needed commodity. They include fullback Bob Sutton and halfback Tom Berry from Valley J. C. in Los Angeles; halfback Arlo Wenstrand, Modesto, Calif., J. C.; halfback John Laird, from College of the Sequoias, Visalia, Calif.; and fullback Chuck Marsh, Lower Columbia J. C. in Longview, Wash.

## McKay Tells Foreign Game Hunting Rules

WASHINGTON (P)—Secretary of the Interior McKay Wednesday announced regulations for American hunters who want to bring home ducks, geese and other migratory game birds shot this fall in Canada or Mexico.

Such birds brought or shipped from Canada must have the head, head plumage and feet attached if they have been dressed and must be accompanied by tags and permits if such are required by provincial or dominion law.

The limits on migratory game birds which may be brought into the United States are:

Ducks, 10 of any species; geese (except Ross' geese), 5 of any species; brant, 6; coot, 25; woodcock, 8; jacksnipe 8; band-tailed pigeons, 6; doves (mourning and white-wing) 10, singly or in the aggregate of both kinds; rails and gallinules (except sora), 30, singly or in the aggregate, and sora, 25.

A shipment made not later than five days after the close of the Canadian or Mexican season may continue in transit for not more than five additional days to permit delivery.

Federal regulations do not authorize import or possession of such birds contrary to state law.

Packages must be marked with the name and address of the shipper and the consignee, with an accurate statement of the numbers and kind of birds clearly shown on the outside.

## Portland Wins Again... Stars Regain Top Spot in Coast League Race

Leadership in the Pacific Coast League baseball race was again changed Wednesday night as Hollywood blanked San Francisco, 1-0, and Seattle handed San Diego a 5-1 beating, breaking the Star-Padres tie for top spot and giving Hollywood a full game over the Padres.

In the only other PCL game, Portland downed Sacramento for the second night in a row, 5-1.

Southpaw Lino Donoso was in superb form as he hurled the Hollywood victory, allowing only four hits. Tommy Saffell's single in the first inning, followed by singles by Lee Walls and Dale Long produced the game's only run off San Francisco righthander Ed Chandler.

Tommy Byrne held San Diego to three hits for the Rainier win. Bob Alexander held Sacramento to five hits and gave Portland the victory in the rubber contest of a five-game series. It was the final home game this season for the Solons.

Marino Pieretti was trying for his 16th pitching victory when the Beavers got to the Solon ace for two runs in the third inning. Alexander singled, Ed Basinski walked and Fletcher Robbe slugged the first of three doubles.

Robbe's third double in the eighth was responsible for a run when Rocky Krsnich singled to left.

In the ninth off Al Cicotte, who was making his first start in six weeks since injuring his shoulder, the Beavers added two more on a single by Joe Rossi, a walk to Alexander, a single to left by Frank Austin, a safe bout by Basinski and Robbe's sacrifice fly.

PHILADELPHIA (P)—A case of mumps helped make history here Wednesday night as George Justice, Philadelphia welterweight, defeated fellow townsmen Ellwood Davis and Bobby Bell, Youngstown, Ohio, and Ike Chestnut of New York, fought to a draw in the first "studio-home audience" nationally televised fight show ever presented.

Some 2,000 boxing fans—about the size of a large studio audience—were admitted free to the double wrap-up program of six-rounders, a substitute for the welterweight title fight between Kid Gavilan and challenger Johnny Saxton. Gavilan came down with a case of the mumps Tuesday 24 hours before he was scheduled to make his eighth title defense.

Faced with the choice of breaking the uninterrupted four-year Wednesday TV fight show series, promoter Herman Taylor and the International Boxing Club of New York came up at the last minute with the double wrapup.
