Holly-Bowl Racing Off

There will be no auto racing at Salem's Hollywood Bowl this week or next as Valley Sports officials do not wish to conflict with the annual State Fair. Racing will resume at the bowl on the weekend of September 11-12.

Many local racing fans are looking forward to a big event Sunday at Portland, when the Indianapolis-type big cars will go after the 1954 Pacific Coast championship in a 100-lap race on the Portland Meadows dirt racing strip. A total of 37 entries, many from California, has been registered for the 100-mile classic.

Time trials start at 1:30 p.m. Sunday. Many of the entries have been getting the "feel" of the dirt oval in test runs this week, preparing for the Sunday title event.

A two-threat coach is Ellis P. (Dumpy) Hagler at Duke University. Besides directing football lines in action, he also coached the Duke University golf team to 14 conference titles in the last 19 years.

Saxons Set First Scrimmage Saturday

After four days of practice in which to adjust his 70 candidates for their new role as the South Salem High grid team, Coach Lee Gustafson has called for the first full scale scrimmage of his charges for Saturday morning.

The climax of the two-day football drills that the Saxons have been running through since Monday is set for 9 a.m.

Thursday's practice concentrated on plays. During the drills, tackling and blocking assignments were worked out on dummies. First injury to the Saxon squad came Thursday when Dale Jones, 6-2, 185-pound end, pulled a muscle that will sideline him for a few days.

Only a week remains before the Saxons play host to Washington of Portland on Saturday, Sept. 11. Between now and game time the Saxons will concentrate on their offense, says Gustafson. Gustafson will not commit himself as to who the likely starters will be in the game with Washington, but some of the aspirants are already looking good in the early drills.

These include letterman quarterback Herb Juran and halfbacks Neil Scheidel and Jim Anderson, also returning lettermen. A likely looking candidate at fullback is LaMoynne Mapes, a husky 165-pounder.
