

Church-Sponsored Migrant Camp Program Considered Big Success in Salem Area

Children learned to read, to wash and some to use a toothbrush for the first time during the Polk-Marion migrant worker's program sponsored this summer by Salem Council of Churches.

Enlarged over the previous year's program it was "very much a success," according to the Rev. Harold W. Black, chairman of the Salem Migrant Committee.

Although the cost of the program was only a little over \$900, the Rev. Mr. Black explained that this was only possible because of generous contributions from Salem firms and service organizations. Everything from automobiles to bedding was loaned to the program.

The program was run primarily by four young women, the Misses Joan Nicholson, Mt. Sterling, Ohio, supervisor for the Salem area; Carolyn Miller, Whittier, Calif.; Jacque Ritchie, Bakersfield, Calif.; and Betsy Sharp, Laceyville, Pa.

New this year is the extension of the program to the Stayton area during the August break season. Daily children's programs were held in one larger camp and nightly programs put on in other camps.

Available for the migrant workers was a lending library and moving pictures. The staff also sponsored a weekly program for the workers in the Stayton Community Building which included community singing, talent and movies.

Migrant work in the Independence area started early in July. Here two large camps were served with daily afternoon children's programs.

These programs which reached more than 60 children stressed religious education, music, group recreation and individual play. Health education and crafts were also taught.

Visitors Reach 700
An estimated 650 to 700 children and adults were reached by weekly evening programs of home visitation, informal recreation and movies. Such activities were taken to six camps in the Independence area.

Young women and mothers were brought together in another camp to meet for a weekly sewing group. Some 10 to 15 women met to sew, embroider, knit and crochet.

The staff discussed with the Public Health departments of Marion and Polk Counties the possibility of extending health and education services to the migrant workers.

Plans for Next Year
Big plans are already being made for next summer, according to the Rev. Mr. Black. He explains that efforts are going to be made in interesting students from Willamette University and O. C. E. in helping with the program.

A farewell get-together was held recently at the Ernest P. Goulder home in honor of this summer's student staff.

Special guests for the event were those serving migrant camps in other sections of Oregon: The Rev. and Mrs. Frank Reyes, Nyssa; Joyce Givens, Hillsboro, and Mary McFarland, Milton-Freewater.

FBI Warns of Baby Sitters Who Kidnap

WASHINGTON (AP)—J. Edgar Hoover, director of the FBI, said Saturday parents of small children should use particular care in selecting a baby sitter because one of the latest law enforcement problems "is the baby sitter turned kidnaper."

In an editorial addressed to all law enforcement officials in the current issue of the Federal Bureau of Investigation law enforcement bulletin, Hoover said:

"One of the latest law enforcement problems is the baby sitter turned kidnaper. I have noted that in a group of seven cases referred to the FBI for investigation in late 1953 and early 1954, all involving small children, six of the seven alleged kidnapers were women and each of them had been acting as a baby sitter for the victim."

"In the seventh case, the abductor was the husband of a woman who had recently had the child in her care.

"There were eight children abducted in these seven cases and all of them were recovered unharmed. Such fortunate results can hardly be expected however in all future cases.

"The average age of the victims was less than 21 months, an age at which children change so rapidly that visual identification may soon be complicated by considerable doubt.

"It is also worth noting that one of the victims was taken over a thousand miles from his home and the average distance in all seven cases was well over 400 miles. This is an additional complicating factor in locating and identifying the victims and the kidnaper."

Written Invitation
LEBANON, N. H. (AP)—A sign reading "Open House" on Bob Rousseau's gas station apparently was taken too literally.

An employee coming to open the station found a window open and \$180 missing from the cash register.

The sign, put up to advertise a special offer, was taken down immediately.

'Frame' Hinted In Case of French Official

SYDNEY, Australia (AP)—The leader of Australian's opposition Labor Party declared here on a feminine French diplomat arrested on the basis of testimony in the Petrov spy inquiry may have been framed.

Dr. Herbert Evatt, who was foreign minister when his party was in power, said in a statement the charges against Mrs. Rose-Marie Ollier, 45, may well turn out to have been "deliberately falsified and fabricated to injure her and her friends."

The statement, addressed to French Ambassador Louis Roche, said Mrs. Ollier finds herself "defamed throughout the world as a spy apparently on the say so of two paid informers, surely this is worse than McCarthyism."

Refers to Petrov
He referred to Vladimir Petrov the former Soviet Embassy official who says he headed a widespread espionage ring in Australia, and to Petrov's wife, Evdokia, both of whom have obtained asylum here.

Petrov told a royal commission on espionage that Mrs. Ollier gave him vital information on shipments of Australian war material to Indochina while she was vice consul and second secretary of the French Embassy, Petrov said he relayed the information to Moscow.

Evatt has previously attacked the handling of the Petrov case by the conservative Liberal-Country Party coalition government of Prime Minister Robert G. Menzies. Several of Evatt's staff members have been named in the Petrov testimony.

Evatt was critical of Roche, who disclosed the arrest Friday of Mrs. Ollier on the French island of New Caledonia Aug. 22 on the basis of Petrov's testimony. Said Evatt: "I express the hope and confidence that the French government will show more sense of propriety and justice—not to say chivalry—to Mme. Ollier than has been exhibited by the French ambassador in Australia."

"I suggest that the government should dispatch to Australia forthwith a leading lawyer who will be given full opportunity of investigating the truth of the Petrov's accusations against Mme. Ollier and interrogating the Petrovs to see whether or not there has been a deliberate attempt to injure her and ruin her career for vicious purposes."

Mrs. Ollier is being returned to France, a French Foreign Ministry spokesman said she would be charged in a French court with "grave failure" in exercising her duties as an employee of the government.

The spokesman said Australia had "kindly warned the French government of Petrov's allegations and it is now up to French authorities to take appropriate measures."

DREAMY THEFT
ROCKFORD, Ill. (AP)—Edwin Kenna, 45, was arrested for walking into an unlocked supermarket, helping himself to two frozen chickens, a loaf of bread, a beef meat pie, a carton of cigarettes and a can of frozen strawberries. Store manager Victor Pozzi who reported the theft said the cash in the till was untouched.

Kenna told police it was "all like a dream."
