

# Truman, McCarthy Plan Few Talks

Two of the most controversial voices in politics—those of Harry Truman and Joseph McCarthy—seem likely to be comparatively still during the campaign now building up to the Nov. 2 elections.

Democratic National Chairman Stephen Mitchell said at Indianapolis Thursday that ex-President Truman is still under doctor's orders to take it easy. Hence, Mitchell said, Truman will be called on for only one major speech—at Kansas City Oct. 16.

Sen. McCarthy (R-Wis), chairman of the Senate investigations subcommittee, said at Washington he will confine himself largely to three speaking engagements he

has already accepted: At Omaha Sept. 25, at Wheaton, Ill., Sept. 26 and Bloomington, Ill., Oct. 1. McCarthy said:

"I have decided that more important than speaking is resuming our work of exposing graft, corruption, and Communists inherited from the prior administration, and thus help fulfill the Republican promise to 'clean up the mess in Washington.'"

With considerable cheerfulness, Democratic national committee-buckled down to work at Indianapolis and looked forward to speeches from leaders at a big banquet Saturday night.

On the Republican side, Postmaster General Arthur Summer-

field told a party gathering in New York the Republicans will win. He said: "No political party ever had more good things to talk about."

Also, Vice President Nixon said at Topeka, Kan., that the newly announced easing of government crop control regulations "has a tendency to pull the rug out from under the Democrats."

And in Louisville, Ky., House Speaker Martin (R-Mass) repeated his prediction that the Republicans will add 15 to 20 seats to their present five-seat majority in the House.

A Republican National Committee publication at Washington meanwhile spoke warningly to the party faithful of what might hap-

pen if the Republicans should lose that slim Senate majority.

## Texas Governor Plans Film Role

AUSTIN, Tex. (UP)—Gov. Allan Shivers will include a stint as a movie actor during his California vacation later this month.

Shivers, renominated three weeks ago to an unprecedented third term, will leave for San Francisco Sunday. His press secretary, Jimmy Banks, said the governor had agreed to act in "a very small part" Sept. 27 in "Lucy Gallant," a film starring Jane Wyman.

# Boy Stows Away on Plane

HONOLULU (UP)—A 14-year-old San Jose boy who said he stowed away aboard a united airlines plane by sitting next to a woman whom he "hoped looked like his mother." Thursday enjoyed the island life while authorities looked for a way to say "aloha."

John Thomas Golden, son of Mr. and Mrs. T. R. Marsh, arrived here Tuesday with \$2.20 in his jeans. He was given an aloha (meaning welcome) by Mrs. Aileen Ferreira, a Mackay radio attendant at the Moana Hotel on Waikiki Beach.

Island authorities prepared an Aloha (meaning good bye) Wednesday, but held off until word was received from his parents and it was definitely established he had stowed away.

Golden told Father Roebuck of Catholic Social Service here that he stowed away on the plane after hitch hiking from San Jose to San Francisco's International airport. Fr. Roebuck said the boy sat down next to a woman whom he hoped the stewardess thought was his mother.

Golden "walked right on board the plane" and the stewardess never asked for a ticket or counted passengers, he told Fr. Roebuck.

He got off the plane here, took off his shoes and hitched to Waikiki where he met Mrs. Ferreira when he decided to tell his parents where he was.
