Members of the group also are planning to attend a workshop meeting at McMinnville Oct. 13. The society has voted to donate \$25 toward purchase of new hymn books for the church.

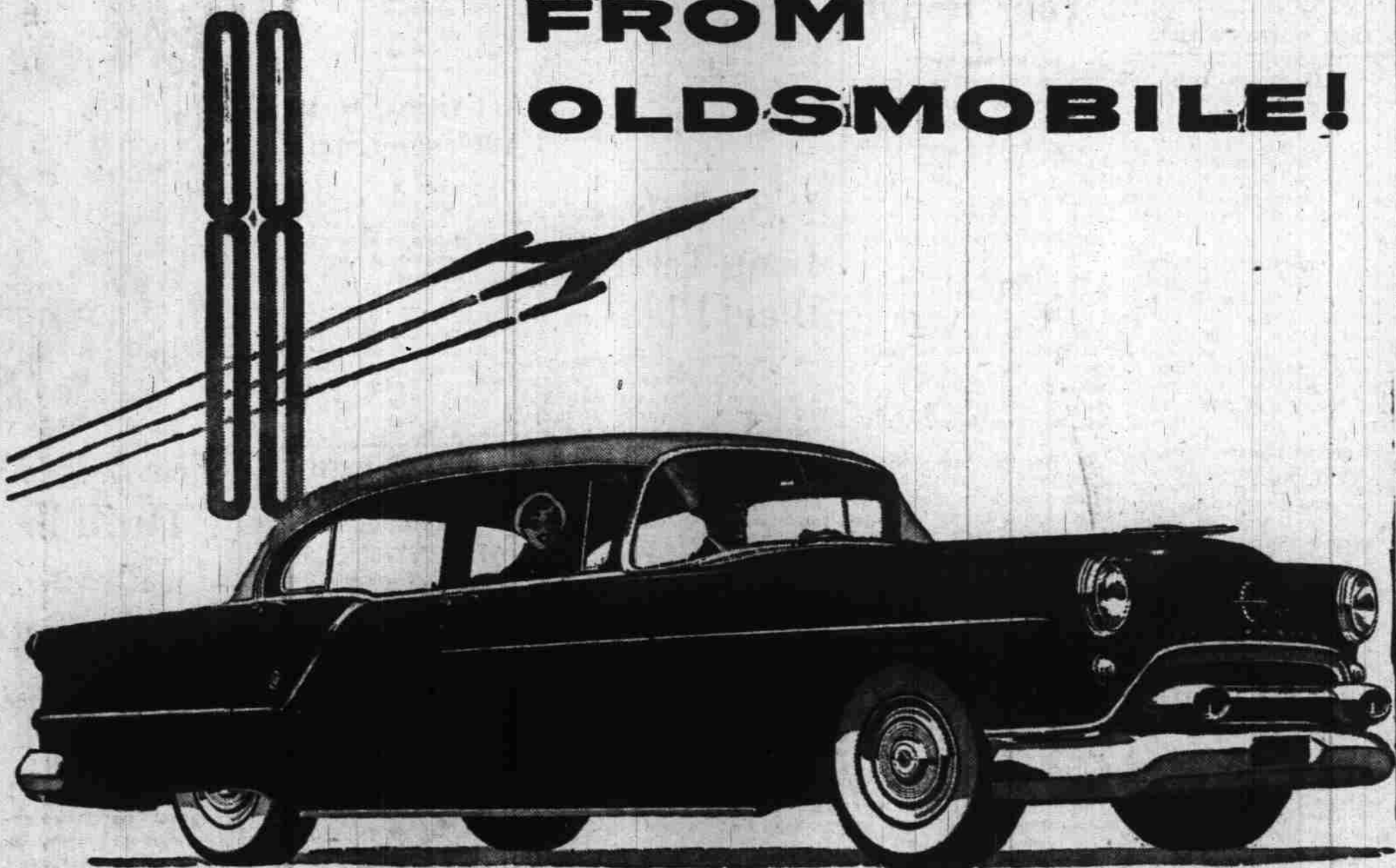
