

Weather Handicaps McKay in Campaign

WASHINGTON—Oregon isn't the only state in which politics are getting pretty stormy this fall, as Secretary of Interior Douglas McKay can readily testify.

McKay is being deluged with speaking invitations from Republican groups from coast to coast, his aides say, but the secretary is beginning to wonder whether he can weather the entire campaign.

It seems he began his chores for the Grand Old Party in solid Republican Iowa last week—but it turned so cold the day he was there for an outdoor meeting that all his listeners climbed into their autos to keep warm.

McKay went through with his speech, utterly unshaken as he was being heard.

Then last week-end the secretary set out for Maine. But he didn't get past Boston, where hurricane Edna stopped him in his tracks. After talking by telephone with Gov. Burton M. Cross—who got caught in a Democratic "hurricane" himself two days later—McKay learned the political rally was being cancelled due to the storm.

So he watched his first hurricane from a Boston hotel window.

And he's got some 40 speech-making appearances to go before election day.

Time Article Helped

Aides attribute McKay's apparent increase in popularity to the article in Time magazine recently which featured the secretary's portrait on the magazine cover. Reader's Digest has picked up the article for republication in slightly condensed form in its October issue.

McKay isn't likely to change his "country boy" manner, which was heavily played up in the Time story, not after reading the complimentary fan mail provoked by the story. His aides say McKay fans expressed pleasure in this homely quality of McKay and blasted away at the "city slickers" they were sure had overrun Washington, D.C.

Enjoyed Alaska
McKay surprises friends in Washington by telling of the "delightful" time he enjoyed in Alaska recently, contrary to the impression gained by many here from press reports of a stormy session he had with statehood advocates.

"Alaskans: a fine people," says McKay.

He enjoys telling of the box of assorted vegetables he was given by a farmer in the Matanuska Valley, which he had converted into a delicious salad aboard his car on the Alaska Railroad.

Praise For McKay
President Eisenhower gave McKay an unexpected (and unsolicited) pat on the back this past week in a letter to Sen. Wallace Bennett (R., Utah), who wanted to know the president's attitude toward the billion dollar upper Colorado River reclamation project which bogged down in Congress last month.

The letter praised the project and McKay and his resource development policies—one of the big election issues in the West this autumn.

Airline Plans Orient Flight Via Alaska

SAN FRANCISCO (UP)—Pan American World Airways said Tuesday it may soon be able to offer non-stop 12½ hour passenger service from the United States to Japan via the "Great Circle Route."

Col. Clarence M. Young, executive vice president of Pan American's Pacific-Alaska division, said the company was waiting only for delivery of the new Douglas DC-7C clippers and approval from the Civil Aeronautics Board to use the Great Circle route.

Young said the company has asked the CAB to remove an "obsolete" provision in its certificate requiring PAA to stop at a mid-Pacific island on its way to the Orient.

Northwest Airlines is at present the only regular passenger line to use the shorter northern route from Seattle to Tokyo via Anchorage and the Aleutians. Northwest's trip takes approximately 16 hours.

Pan-Am hoped to make Seattle its west coast port of entry with co-terminals in San Francisco and Los Angeles, Young said. But it would continue to use the present mid-Pacific route by way of Hawaii and Wake Island.

Young said the new DC-7C clippers, due for delivery in 1956, will be especially adapted for long-range, over-ocean flying. The plane will be able to cruise at 365 miles an hour non-stop for 5223 miles. The distance from Seattle to Tokyo is 4770 miles.

Order Stops Priest River Dam Action

EPHRATA, Wash. (U)—Grant County Public Utility District has been issued a temporary restraining order banning the Washington State Power Commission from taking any further action in regard to the proposed Priest Rapids project on the Columbia River, it was disclosed Monday night.

The restraining order, issued by Grant County Superior Judge Robert T. Hunter last Friday, is the newest flareup in a running battle between the PUD and the newly authorized commission over which agency should construct the dam, to be located 25 miles below the Vantage bridge.

Sec. McKay in Wyoming on Campaign Trip

CODY, Wyo. (U)—The voters must choose in the November elections between "the far-sighted, constructive Eisenhower program" or a "socialist empire of government ownership and control," Secretary of the Interior McKay said here Monday night.

He told a Republican rally that Republican control of Congress is "essential if we are to continue to have honesty, integrity and efficiency in government in place of the old chiseling, grafting and extravagance."

"If the Democrats were to gain a majority in the 84th Congress, they would work overtime trying to embarrass and hamstring the Eisenhower administration," he told the 500 persons present.

McKay said the Republicans have accomplished much in the last two years.

"They have reduced the threat of socialism and communism within our borders. They have strengthened our defense against aggression from abroad. They have, in short, added in a thousand different ways to the continued peace and prosperity of our people," he said.

SEATTLE (U)—United Air Lines announced Monday it will begin 3½ hour non-stop flights between Seattle and Los Angeles Oct. 25, using 365-mile-an-hour DC7s on the run for the first time.
